Ron for the Road

I once attended the Christmas party of a Bay Area advertising agency. Never in my life, before or since, have I heard so much vacuous, inane and superficial conversation



from so many people so pervasively. They were constantly trying to find that one little cutesy phrase that will be tagged onto a brand name each and every time that brand is mentioned. One that comes to mind and which never seemed to fit in any instance it was used was "Oh, what a feeling!"

A car company currently has one that makes a bit more sense with the idea of moving "forward" or "onward" or to "the road ahead." This newsletter is certainly moving in positive directions. In spite of routinely getting excellent reviews from advertisers and members about the quality of the paper and printing, the Board has been looking at the gap (red ink!) between advertising income and per member rebates from PCA on the income side versus the costs of printing and mailing. Similar to the Social Security situation, looking down this financial road is an eventual shortage of funds at some point.

The option to go back to lower quality paper and printing was considered by having actual samples and was discarded. One alternative was to increase ad income and I am very pleased to see our progress as evident on pages two and twenty-three of this issue. We are definitely moving forward with four full pages of Porsche dealer ads in this edition. Porsche (Porsche Cars of North America) marketing and Porsche dealerships apparently value quality in printing and graphics so there is a match for our mutual benefit. I seriously doubt that the new ads would have been obtained had we gone back to cheaper printing options.

We are also currently considering another move forward by increasing the number of pages. The March edition required cutting some full pages to half size and deleting others as the new full page ads used space previously available. More pages increases cost again so our additional ad income does not go as far as would be ideal; nevertheless, it is progress. Two benefits that may accrue with more space are the possibility for larger photos and more space available for captions and the identification of people in the photos.

Speaking of photos, I have chosen to spend a considerable amount of money on newer equipment and a much larger amount of time taking and processing photos. At the 3/12 Monster Park GGR autocross, I put driving into second priority so I could get more photos and came home with 110 JPEGs. If you consider that I typically go through about 35 clicks, i.e., click to open, click to drag into Photoshop, click to re size, click to crop, etc., per photo as part of a digital camera workflow, one autocross is a huge demand on my time. Fortunately, I truly love working with these photos so the payoff is pleasure rather than obligation and fatigue.

Another aspect of the pleasure part is the responsiveness of the gallery viewers as indicated by 57 page visitors (only 11 pictures posted) the day (Saturday evening) of the event! By 11:00 AM Sunday morning (25 images posted), 88 visitors had been counted.

Another big plus, is the tangible support from people such as Jeff Kost who is a VP at SanDisk, the manufacturer of outstanding products for digital media, e.g., camera memory cards. Jeff and his wife drive a beautiful black 993 in the Ni class and has shown his appreciation for the photos by providing the photographer with memory cards. All of the 110 3/12/05 autocross photos were captured on a single SanDisk Ultra II CompactFlash card and it appears that an Ultra III will be arriving soon. All you digital camera users need to think of Jeff and SanDisk just like any other of our sponsors. Give your business to the good folks who pay for ads or give other support to the work of the Diablo Region.






When You Need it Most

It's easy for most of us to respond to Ron's invitation to recall times when we've gotten unexpected help from thoughtful Porsche owners, like the time

when this elegant, little old lady in the immaculate 356 stopped and offered to help me change a tire. (Yes, that really happened.)

But what's more interesting is the unsolicited help we often get from non-Porsche owners. Some strange blend of curiosity, car envy, and good Samaritanism causes people to step forward and give extraordinary help to a Porsche owner they would never offer to the driver of a Chevy Malibu in the same circumstances.

During the mid-1970s, I and my too small sons were cruising along the Pennsylvania Turnpike in my 1969 911T at 75 mph on our way from our home in northern Virginia to the Parade which was being held at the then Playboy Club in Lake Geneva, WI. The temperature was in the upper 90s, but the A/C was keeping us cool. Without warning, the engine simply stopped. By some amazing good fortune, we were right by an exit, which I took, coasted up the ramp, across the overpass, and down into a rural gas station. The three old guys who were sitting out in front of the station were stunned to see this beautiful, exotic car coast up into their station.

I was pretty sure I knew what the problem was: the Marelli fuel pump, which had previously shown a tendency to malfunction at high temperatures. In response to my questions, the station owner said there was an auto parts store in the next town. I called them and determined they had a GM truck fuel pump which sounded like it was fairly close to the pressure specs of the Marelli. Immediately, one of the other guys jumped up and offered to go get it. While he was doing that, the other guys helped me push the car onto the lift because I wasn't absolutely certain the problem was the fuel pump, and I wanted to drain the fuel tank. Of course, having learned painful lessons in the past, I carried a full set of tools, so I proceeded to drain the tank and in the process got gasoline in my eyes. Let me just say that's something you want to avoid.

The guy returned with the GM fuel pump, and I got lots of eager advice and assistance from all three of the old guys about installing it. We rolled the car out to the pumps, filled it up, and, miraculously, it fired up and ran beautifully.

Even so, I wasn't sure everything was going to keep working, so I stopped at the Pittsburgh airport, put the two boys on a plane to Chicago, and called to ask friends at the Parade to pick them up, which, of course, they readily agreed to do. The rest of my journey was smooth and uneventful. What I didn't know until I got there was that my friends who had agreed to pick up my sons at the Chicago airport also had a breakdown and had to call on another Porsche friend to make the pick up, which was late, leaving the two "unaccompanied minors" slightly scared and in the care of the airlines for awhile.

When I arrived exhausted late that night, my wife and daughter (who had flown up) and the two boys were all asleep as if nothing out of the ordinary had happened. So, once again, Porsche owners can count on help not only from fellow Porschefiles but also from the many good citizens who are intrigued with the Porsche.






