



## Diablo Board of Directors Application

Thank you for expressing interest in serving on the Porsche Club of America (PCA) Diablo Region Board of Directors.

Diablo Region received its charter from PCA in 1984 and is incorporated in the State of California as a 501(c)(7) non-profit organization in accordance with the California Corporations Code.

The Board is responsible for the proper conduct of the administrative affairs of the Diablo Region, the proper functioning of the various committees, and compliance with the Region Bylaws.

Pursuant to the Region's Bylaws, the Board is comprised of seven (7) members. Director terms commence January 1<sup>st</sup> in the year following their election. Directors serve two-year terms that are staggered with four Directors being elected in even numbered years and three Directors elected in the odd numbered years. For the 2021 election, there are three (3) current Board vacancies to be filled.

Each year, the Board elects from among themselves the positions of President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer and Directors at Large. Board meetings are held monthly on the second Monday of the month, typically from 6:00 PM to 7:30 PM. Since the Covid-19 crisis, the Board has been meeting via conference call.

Once the Nominating Committee receives your application, we'll schedule a brief interview during the week of August Board meeting so that we may place names of qualified candidates in nomination before the Board at the August Board Meeting.

Since 1990, I have served on several California statewide working groups and coalitions related to energy deregulation, energy efficiency, energy management and service reliability and have testified before multiple state and federal regulatory agencies as an expert witness.</p> <p style="margin-top: 10px;">I served on the Board of Directors for a national energy industry association formerly known as the Association for Demand Response &amp; Smart Grid headquartered in Washington DC. This organization is comprised of several hundred members ranging from Fortune 500 companies e.g., IBM, Siemens, Johnson Controls, PG&amp;E, Southern Company etc. to individual members from industry and academia. The board was comprised of 10 members representing various diverse membership elements in the electric industry e.g., utilities, equipment and controls manufacturers, consultants, regulators, academics, etc.</p>		



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I was a member for 25 years and later chaired for 3 years the Data Analytics Technical Committee of the Association of Edison Illuminating Companies' (AEIC). The AEIC was founded by Thomas Edison in 1885 and its current membership is comprised of senior level leaders of 165+ utilities across North America and Asia. The organization's membership represents roughly 85% of the electric generating capacity in North America. The Committee is comprised of 30 senior managers representing member utilities across North America. In my capacity as Chair, I represented the Committee on the AEIC's Board of Directors.

In my capacity as a senior manager at PG&E, I often consulted with the utility's Executive Management on matters related to customer energy management and customer care.

As an officer at the international energy consulting firm Nexant Inc., I consulted with executive leaders at various utility clients throughout North America as well as being involved in the firm's business development and strategic planning.

What talents and skills do you bring to the Board?

I currently operate a small boutique LLC with two partners consulting with Utilities, Public Service Commissions and independent oversight boards on matters related to Energy Efficiency, Energy Management, and renewable power.

- Management and oversight

What would you like to achieve while serving on the Diablo Region Board?

- Work closely with fellow Board members and Chairs to bring more metrics-based decision making to the Board.
  - Use research e.g., available PCA membership data &/or member surveys to better understand our diverse membership's needs or desires.
  - Conduct short post event surveys to guide future event improvements
- Utilize these needs assessment data findings to diversify events, offer potential new services, encourage & engage previously "dormant" members
- Increase participation by general membership through increasing the number and diversity of events offered to Diablo Region's membership



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- Provide services to broader segment of the membership
- Strengthen ties with existing partners and bring on additional new partners to our mutual benefit
- Cultivate volunteerism among the membership leading to a line of succession in leadership positions (chairs, BOD etc.) with the club

What more would you like us to know about your qualifications to serve on the Diablo Region Board?

I have driven Porsches for several decades although my first ownership experience wasn't until 2004 with the purchase of a 2002 Boxster S. Unfortunately, it took me ten years to join PCA primarily due to some preconceived misconceptions about the Club and its membership. Those ten lost years were a mistake that I still kick myself over!

Porsche as a manufacturer has changed radically since the dawn of the 21<sup>st</sup> Century with "Wasserkühlung" and several "nontraditional" model lines. In the future, the pace of change will surely quicken, especially with propulsion systems and additional model lines. As the Club's advertising tag line says, "it's the people" which rings so true! The face of Porsche owners i.e., the face of PCA is also changing. We must be prepared as a club to embrace change and adapt by meeting the needs of our traditionalist "Luftgekühlt" members as well as our newest members who have purchased their very first Porsche which may be a vintage sports car or more likely an SUV, a four-door sedan, or even an electric powered Taycan. Along with the machinery, the club's demographics are also changing. PCA is a "big tent" with Diablo's membership now nearly 1,600 strong.
