



Great food and great people!! What more could you ask for! Mark your calendar to be sure to attend at least one dining opportunity.






Pleasanton Saturday Breakfast





2011 Wash & Shine Pre-Registration on the Web By Steve Jones

This year Diablo Region invites all Wash & Shine entrants to pre-register and save 20% on their entry fee. Please remember that if you use this new online form you must still mail a check to the region Treasurer for \$20 per car entered, and note the model and color of each car. Checks should be payable to "Diablo PCA" and sent to: Diablo PCA; P.O. Box 1047; Livermore, CA 94551-1047.

The pre-registration form is on our region's website at this URL: http://diablo-pca.org/wash-and-shine-entry-form.html. Or if you go to our region homepage, look for the item "Wash and Shine Entry Form" in the main menu, as shown here:



Clicking on this item will take you to the pre-registration form; please be sure to read the instructions at the top of this page. If a field has a red asterisk next to is (like this: *), then you are required to supply an answer for that field in order to submit your entry.

There are three sections of the form: Entrant Information, Car Information, and the Submission Section. The Entrant Information section is just basic information about how to contact you. The Car Information section reflects very basic information about the car being entered, and a class in which to enter the car.

The list of classes reflects 12 categories where judges will be evaluating all entries in the class and assigning a numeric score. This isn't as strict as a formal *concours d'elegance*, but points


are still deducted when the judges find visible areas of the car that haven't been cleaned. After each car has been inspected and final scores calculated, the car with the highest score in it's class wins.

If you don't want to have judges to go looking for dirt in your car, you can choose to enter in the Peoples Choice class. In this case you are eligible for awards in five categories, where the winners are determined by votes cast by any attendee, Porsche owner or not.

- Road Warrior Meanest, Baddest, Wickedest
- "Taste of the Rainbow" Your favorite color
- Boulevard Cruiser Best Main Street Cruiser
- Spiffy Wheels Your pick for the best wheels
- Hollywood Match-up Driver and Car best coordinated

The final section of the form will look familiar to many of you who spend a lot of time exploring the Internet. Spammers like to use automated programs to abuse forms whenever they find them, so this form includes a simple check to make sure a human being is filling it out, commonly called a *captcha*. (For a full explanation of what these are and how they work, see http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Captcha.)

Before you can submit your entry form, you must read the four numbers and/or letters from the image at the left, and enter them into the field to the right. If you have been shown an image where you cannot make out the characters clearly, click on the button between the image and the field and a new graphic will be generated.



In the example above, you would type "**ZE54**" into the field to the right before clicking on the "Submit Form" button.

Special Race Announcement



Fans of vintage racing have a plethora of great local events this year. Starting in June at Infineon Raceway the Sonoma Motorsports Festival will take place. The featured Marque is McLaren (Formula 1 racing) and 26 of these thoroughbreds are entered.

Here is the first series of technical questions some of our members have submitted. A big **THANK YOU** to Manni Viana, Service Manager

at Porsche of Livermore for taking time to answer the questions. Don't forget to submit any tech questions to the editor at editor@diablo-pca.org by the 15th of each month.

1. I understand that the Boxster is not a good race car but that the 914 is. What is the difference and is that true. I have owned both and like the Boxster way better...

Answer: The 914 is a great car for the track and can be adapted to racing quite easily. The Boxster is better suited to Track days and autocross due to Engine limitations but is a lot of Fun to drive. There are some mods that can be done to improve those limitations.

2. My question is regarding wheel alignment on a 2006 Cayman S. If I miss the many nasty California pot holes, don't hit curbs, drive about 8,000 miles a year and my tires appear to be wearing normally, do I still need a wheel alignment? How often? What effect does a track day or autocross have on my wheel alignment?

Answer: If you use your car as described and the tires are wearing evenly, then you do not require an alignment. But if you are tracking the car, it would be more prone to going out of alignment going over rumble strips, etc.

3. On a Boxster, is there some type of drainage system for the roof that keeps water from getting into the car? If so, should it be checked every so often to make sure it is clear? How often would that be and how would you check it?

Answer: Yes, there is a drain system for the roof. The dealers check this during a servicing, but if you live in an area with lots of tree fall out, it is recommended to check them for frequently. (Have your dealership show you where the drain system is located).

4. How often should the oil in a Carrera with weekend and occasional around-town driving be changed?

Answer: Personally, I always recommend that an engine's oil should be changed every year regardless of mileage.

5. I had the oil in my 2002 996 CS changed by a local Porsche dealer. They replaced the Mobil 1 OW-40 with Mobil 1 ESP Formula M 5w40, which I understand is formulated for M-B diesel engines. I believe it is formulated to extend the life of the engine's particulate trap. The Service Manager told me that this oil was approved by Porsche but I did not see it on the approved oils list.

Is there any harm using this oil? The Mobil 1 ESP Formula M 5w40 was in the engine for one year and about 7500 miles. It has since been replaced with OW-40.

Answer: There is absolutely no harm in using this oil and no need to worry.


