#### From the Editor

When the Board approved the switch to the current printer, it was for a three month trial. The third edition is now in preparation so an evaluation of sorts is in order. I have not



heard, either in informal conversations or via email, anything negative so far. I understand that people may be hesitant to make critical statements to my face but, nevertheless, many excellent positive comments have been made about the Advocate's new look. This look, incidentally, derives from several changes including different printing technology and more expensive paper.

One change that may or may not be related to quality is that both the new printer and I are using Mac G4 computers and, in my case, the layout software is Adobe InDesign running on Mac OS X (Jaguar). InDesign on OS X has many advantages over competing programs with easy drop shadows, transparency options and utilization of Open Type fonts among the foremost. Open Type fonts have up to 65,000 characters per font compared to 256 otherwise. This increase allows almost any language and a wide assortment of ligatures and other optional characters. As an example, Cronos Pro, the font I am using in this column, has 32 variations such as semibold caption, semibold display, semibold subhead, semibold subhead italic, etc. and with each having a fill compliment of ligatures and languages.

The editorial contributions, as I see it, come from more photos of real Diablo people (no clip art if a Diablo car or person photo can be located), and a certain esthetic style. Drop shadows and other 2D effects and a wider scope of content, including PCNA and Porsche Motorsports releases and photos, are among the elements that I favor.

With an ace proof reader such as Kathy Angell, assisted by Gary, it would be easy to conclude that each Advocate would entirely be free of errors but there are mistakes that need correcting.

One part of the problem is these people who are so ambivolent about their names. Is it Howard Thomas or Thomas Howard? Is "Scotty" a nickname for Irwin as a first name or does it mean Irwin Scott, alias "IRS." I also had a problem choosing between Bien and Ben in this edition on page 7.

In any case, Scotty's wife Carol was misnamed as Carol Irwin on page 7 in the February edition and I apologize for this mistake.

The wrong starting time for the Brass Door dinner remains an unsolved mystery. Kathy spotted it and I emailed Brian to confirm 6:30. I also found the original announcement showing 6:30 so changed the page accordingly. The problem is likely related to having backup versions since these very complex InDesign documents are subject to any number of gremlins that force you to a backup that may or may not be current.

BTW, my early rising habits worked fine for seeing the SpeedTV's coverage of the Rolex 24 Hour race which began at 3:00 A.M. on Sunday. I was thus able to write the page 15 story first hand. I also received numerous press release updates and photos throughout the race channeled to PCA editors by Donald Bond, our National Newsletter Chaiman. 

#### **Awards Dinner a Hit**

Zone 7 held our annual awards banquet on January 18, 2003. The banquet was held at the Sacramento Doubletree Inn. home of PCA-Parade 2000. Based on comments from the 80 attendees, I recommend you to make plans to attend next year. Susan Fleming made sure that the food was great, decorations fitting the occasion, and great awards (trophy stands with different Porsche model cars for each event). We had nice door prizes as well, courtesy of Niello, Carlsen, and Sonnen Porsche: S-Car-Go racing, Race-place-motorsports; and Sacramento Valley Region. All in all, a great evening, celebrating the 2002 competition season, as well as longtime contributions to the club.

The Zone 7 Lifetime Achievement Award is the most prestigious award, given to those deserving individuals who have contributed to the club and distinguished themselves over many years. At the banquet, this lifetime achievement award was given to Dwight Mitchell from Sacramento Valley Region. Dwight is a longtime club member, former President of both GGR and SVR, former Zone representative, previous recipient of National Enthusiast of the Year, and Manhattan Award winner (overall Parade concours award).

The Zone 7 Enthusiast of the Year Award was given to Larry Adams from Golden Gate Region. Larry is active in Autocross and Rallye, and is an occasional concours participant as well. Larry organized zone concours and rallye events for GGR the last two years, and always offers a hand in events.

The event of the year award was given to the "Scream at the Lake" by Sequoia Region. This event featured a well-run two day autocross with lunch provided both days. Autocrossers were also welcomed by a couple of dozen of the region members at a very nice catered pool-side dinner at private home. Nice welcome, nice event —Event of the Year!

Top concour awards were the Dick Cotrell Award to Gary Spinella, to Dean Tanaka for Rookie of the Year, and to Ken Rinehart for most overall points. In autocross, the top PAX award went to Jim Hayes for the second year (Jim has now sold his car, opening up the award for others in 2003). In rallye, Diablo Region and Kahlers sponsored the John Clever Memorial Rally Award in memory of John who passed away early last year. The inaugural recipients were J. and Jessica Toney.

The Competition Series in Zone 7 is special, and sometimes taken for granted. Only Zones 7 and 8 (out of 13 zones nationally) hold such series. The regions make the events possible, with assistance and support from the event chairs. For 2002, the chairs were Al Armellini for Rallye, Glen Brooksby for Autocross, and Dan Nissim for Concours. My sincere appreciation goes out to these individuals for a successful season.

For 2003, Al will continue as Rallye Chair, with Dean Thomas taking on Autocross and Dean Tanaka taking on the Concours. From our initial scheduling effort, it looks like another great season ahead.

On a related note, Dean has been our zone Webmaster. Rather than Dean doing double duty, we are seeking interested individuals to take on the job of zone Webmaster. Dean can provide specifics on level of commitment, but essentially the web page needs to convey the zone schedule, plus rules and results, with appropriate links to region sites. A creative Webmaster certainly could add his/her own personality and other features as well.



#### **Historic Rolex 24 Hour GT Overall Win**



It is not easy to explain how extraordinary it is for a GT class car to be an overall winner in any race and this is especially true for a race that goes for 24 hours.

Theoretically, the fastest class, e.g., the Daytona Pro-



totypes purpose built for racing, will get further ahead each hour so any advantage will be multiplied by 24. The next fastest class, Sports Racing Prototype II, is also pure race car.

Next comes the GTS class with powerful V8 engines such as the Saleen Mustang or the Corvette. Last and apparently not least, come the Porsches in the GT Class with a production body and dash, for example, that is just like the ones parked at our Saturday breakfasts.

Kevin Buckler, our local (Racer's Group, Sears Point) underdog hero, not only won the lowly GT Class but beat everyone else as well. Although # 66 had a problem free 24 hour race with no accidents or pit time for repairs, it was not attrition that was the key to victory.

Porsche GT cars were routinely driving past, i.e., they were faster, than the Corvettes, the Protype with a Robert Yateos NASCAR Ford engine, the Ferraris and even the Porsche-engined Fabcars that led the first 6 hours.

Kevin was ably assisted by two Porsche young factory drivers. Timo Bernhard and Jorg



Bergmeister, who also partnered in the Racer's Group 24 hour wins at the Rolex and Le Mans events last year.



Other Porsche GT3 RS's were also as fast or faster than Buckler's

#66 but lost laps for repairs from accidents or mechanical failures. Johannes Van Overbeek and David Murry were two the drivers in the locally sponsored #83 (RennWerks) which was on the podium and third overall.

Kyle Petty was one of the drivers in the

Orbit #43 that won the GT pole with German driver Mark

Lieb.

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

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


