The Porsche Crest

Before 1953, Porsches only had the name in script and there was no emblem. Max Hoffman, the U.S. importer, asked Dr. Porsche for such an emblem and, during that lunch, Ferdinand Porsche

sketched what would eventually become the official Porsche crest on a napkin. The three elements were: the Porsche name on top; four quadrants with the antlers and red and black from Baden-Würtemberg's coat of arms, and the shield from Stuttgart's city badge. The rearing stallion is reflective of the city's horse-breeding heritage, i.e., stud garden.

Always exemplifying prestige and the status afforded to Porsches, the crest first appeared in 1953 on the 356 horn button and later on the front hood in 1957. Since a '57 356 coupe was my first Porsche way back in 1959, I now have one more reason to cherish the memory of that fine vehicle.

Ron for the Road

As you may have noticed, there are at least two consistent themes in the editing philosophy of this publication. One is preference to never do clip art if there is a quality photo,



preferrably of Diablo members, that can be used instead. While my backyard tulips do not qualify as members, it was fun to put them in place of some clip art flower thing in the "Spring Flowers" Rally flyer (page 17) last month.

The other trademark of the Advocate has been the addiction to drop shadows everywhere. I will thus bend my rule against clip art if I can get a drawing or whatever onto a transparent (.psd) background. Usually this means to paste the art into a new transparent background file in Photoshop and then select the original background and delete it. You can also select the unwanted portions and "inverse" leaving the parts(s) you want selected. In any case, there can not be a drop shadow unless it is a .psd file with a transparent background.

An emerging trend began in earnest last month with black outline boxes gaining color. I tried a few mostly to see how they would turn out in the black and white print version, and was surprised by the number of positive comments from members who noticed the new colors in the online PDF version.

My original serious interest in the Advocate began not as a potential editor, but as a curious observer wondering how to to get it to a file size that would allow online posting and downloading. I knew, for example that Ken, our fine previous editor, was submitting a CD to the printers of around 38 to 50 MBs for 16 pages with 10 to 15 photos. Not only was this too big to post and download, the size even strained my work Windows machine when trying to open the CD.

So what has been accomplished since those days? Last month 24 richly colored pages reeking with drop shadows and some 40 high resolution images were presented online in a 1.1 MB file size! Even though I have all the details of having achieved this nearly miraculous feat, it is still hard for me to believe. A many fold decrease in file size while increasing the number of pages and quality, e.g., more high resolution photos plus more pages, just does not seem possible.

The digital workflow, including the obvious digital photos, is a major explanation. Adobe and Apple also deserve accolades. Adobe's InDesign layout software leaves their older program previously used with the *Advocate*, PageMaker, and their major competitor, Quark, mostly in the dust. It was the ColorSync filters that are part of the amazing Panther version of the Mac OS that achieved the final reduction in file size.

The "inspiration" for a football photo at the top of the column comes from our good buddies, Jim Bauman and Tom Pickett, who edit the GGR Nugget with heavy doses of humor. Their January edition had a dog photo and, since they have been close friends forever, they have used high school era photos as well. My photo is not a dog, but a Tiger—a Reedley College Tiger on a float in the annual Reedley Raisin Day Parade. If nothing else, it does clearly show the superiority of digital photos when compared to such oldies. The dual GGR editors call their column "Two for the Road" which I like. I could change mine to "Ron for the Road," and, while that does not quite ring the bell for me, I will try it.

On Sunday, 4/11, I posted 45 photos from the Saturday Alameda Point GGR autocross, and had more than 100 visitors by Monday evening, 4/12, and 211 visitors after one week. Wow!



I think "slow traffic keep right" should be a law, don't you? Anyway, I arrived at AutoAffair at exactly 9:45 AM, expecting to be greeted by hungry and impatient members but the only familiar faces I saw belonged to fellow PCA'ers, Ted French, Rob Haitsma and Jack Carpenter. Where is everybody? The tech that was supposed to start at 10:00 AM began 25 minutes late as folks straggled in. Note to self; just because we drive fast cars doesn't mean we drive them that way, and Porsche owners like to be fashionably late.



Pablo Cela of AutoAffair began with introductions and then, at the end of the tech, made an announcement that all sales that day were entitled to a 10% discount. Don't wash or wax in full sun. 3) Costco laundry soap is good for clothes, not so good for Porsches.



There were 21 attendees and many were first timers. I consider my first tech session a success because my primary mission as your tech chairman is to enlighten you on a variety of interesting Porsche related topics. The Q & A session was proof that caring for your car's finish isn't elementary.


