Ron for the Road

Having owned

I certainly have had
more than my share
of "end cut" parking
and other idiosyncratic maneuvers designed to preserve the
exterior appearance

of cars that sell poorly with door dings or damaged alloy wheels. Clever parking is but one aspect of keeping a Porsche pristine; having an expert wheel and tire shop with high standards is another.

Recently while having tires mounted at our fine sponsor (See the ad on page 2), I heard Roger call all of his guys from the alignment bay to a nice BMW in the parking lot that was unloading a new set of very expensive wheels and tires. Why all the fuss and extra people? Roger wanted each wheel to be hand-carried to the tire mounting area and then stacked with fresh, clean cardboard between each wheel. I had a quick look around and there were more examples of why this shop has different standards than the typical low budget place. All seven jack handles are wrapped in thick foam.

This attention toward protecting your Porsche investment may add some pennies to the bill but you will be repaid many times over when it comes to the selling price.

Another item in this general category of tires is wheel balancing. Why should a street or passenger car be taken to a race shop for tire balancing? If the tire shop has enough quality technology to have a thin tread race tire, i.e., less tread depth to absorb road roughness, run smoothly on the track at 120 mph or better, then your full tread passenger or street tire will easily run smoothly at half that speed. In fact, the new thin treaded Dunlops that Roger's people put on two weeks ago, were so smooth that three digits appeared in my odometer dial when the frustration of jammed

traffic gave way to some open space as I moved from fourth to sixth gear.

I autocrossed at CRAB for three runs on Saturday, 4/23 and then hit the road (as we now are saying: "Ron for the Road") for a Mennonite Historical Society annual meeting in Fresno. Hwy. 99 was congested, so the down to fourth and back to fifth and sixth was the routine. It was a long day of more than 400 miles since I skipped the evening meeting to get back to CRAB and photograph the Sunday events.

By the way, once you add in my late entry and count by people rather than by couples or registrations, Diablo had more CRAB participants than any other Region other than the SVR host group. Eugenie had a remarkable weekend with her "new" 911. For example, she beat me in the autocross, but my handy dandy list of autoross excuses came up with, "I was testing tire pressures for my new Dunlops and was thus not full-out racing."

The number of visitors to the photos on my homepage of GGR and other driving event galleries continues to amaze me. One page has only been up a two days and yet the total for five driving events was over 1000. The 5/2 GGR autoross page, posted on Monday the 3rd, had 222 visitors by Thursday the 6th. Only one day later, the overall total for driving events was over 1200*. Even my "Blossom Trail" pictures had 92 visitors. I am also getting some intersting "Send me" messages.

In case anyone noticed, the Saturday photos from the Road & Track Invitational at Laguna benefitted from an editor perk when I obtained a photographer's armband and pass. This pass included the combination to all the gate locks that keep others from the trackside windows in the fencing while we armband people can use them for close-up photos.



CRAB 31 Rally

Several cars ran the CRAB 31 Rally without an odometer and succeeded in one winning a class and the other placing second in a class— I tried so hard to make this an easy event.

All 24 cars that started the 2-hour, 80-mile long event completed the course and passed through all of the check-points. This event used instructions (grid pattern of 10 instructions per page) borrowed from a basic format to be used at the Porsche Parade rally this year in Fort Worth. I opted to provide mileages for all of the instructions (easy to calculate the perfect times at any point that was in the route instructions). A pictorial or "tulip" diagram was not provided, as I did not want to present too much information on a single line.

This rally had some special equipment requirements associated with it: only watches, paper, pencil and "stickies" were allowed in an attempt to level the playing field. Jessica and



J. Toney won the Class C with a score of 56 seconds. Running without a working odometer, Mike and Emily Willis had a score of 60 to win Class R. Tish Gleason and Al Armellini of **Diablo Region** had a score of 85 for the win in Class A.

Rounding out the class winners were Kirk and Linda Bradford with a score of 128 in Class B. The other car running without a working odometer was Ron and Sally Boeck. They picked up a second place in Class A with a score of 178.

There were two short legs (4 minutes and 7 minutes) that allowed for some very low scores. Then two other legs of approximately 35 minutes (which coincidentally had



the same elapsed time) gave a chance for everyone to separate themselves from the other contestants.

The general route explored the area around the Sacramento International Airport and the small towns of Nicolaus and East Nicolaus. In fact we used some of the same roads and checkpoint locations as were used in the 2000 Parade Rally. Potty stops were plentiful (after Mike Willis turned the porta potty at checkpoint 2/3 so that we could get to the door). And a few cars were treated to the "North by Northwest" experience of a plane (crop duster) coming toward

you as used a dirt landing strip parallel to the rally road.

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
