Ron for the Road

labeled with the word "burnout." Those members who have been around for a few years can very likely list any number of former Diablo Region officers and other volunteers who once served with fervor and high levels of activity, but who are now mostly inactive.

There are, of course, other explanations, but burnout probably leads any list of those reasons. Having once been a manager of a group of helping professionals, I took notice of many signs of burnout in spite of these professional psychologists being paid a decent salary. Requests for part-time contracts, calls at mid-afternoon stating (not requesting) that they were going home were among these burnout indicators. Since we were all trained as behavioral scientists, we faced the issue with a series of meetings, brainstormed possible solutions and agreed on a plan for action.

One part of the plan was to make our results more visible. In my case, for example, I was raised in a Mennonite community where it was clearly unacceptble to "toot your own horn" so drawing attention to one's achievements was very hard. I found it both easier and more effective to make results visible with descriptions, e.g., "when," rather than "I'm." The distinction is a desription of behavior versus a judgment of character. To this day, the phrase "I'm the greatest..." really grates on my nerves.

Burnout can be prevented by charging your psychological batteries through recognition of work well done, but it is not that simple. A large portion of volunteer work is done in the background, so that is why making result more visible is so important, but only the first step.

When I said "good boy" to my son after cleaning up in the shop area, he reacted with a quizical look. He had also just been down in a forbidden creek area and had difficulty owning the good boy label, i.e. his battery was not charged much, if any. Had I said, "Derek, it's easy and enjoyable to do work in the shop after (when) you put all the tools away in the right places.

In this "when" instance, Derek knew it was his behavior that produced the result and he felt recognized and gained new energy. Telling our current leadership and volunteers, "good job" is better than nothing but specifying the behavior that produced the satisfaction goes farther in keeping us all energized and fully functioning.

Herb Schreib did an excellent job of listing, i.e., making visible, Marilynn Miller's mostly behind-the-scenes contributions to our club at our recent Fiesta. Alas, (just kidding) it was too late to keep her from moving to Arizona.

Speaking of moving, a couple that has made many significant contributions, especially on behalf of the *Advocate*, is also working on their move. There is, therefore, extra urgency in the "Volunteer needed" next to Kathy and the proof/mailer position on page three. Not only do both Gary and Kathy have the typical school teacher eagle eye for misspellings and missing commas, they also have the historical overview of the region to catch things that may be amiss from that perspective. Gary can also see font anomalies that I can see only if I use a 400% view on my computer screen.

If you have conluded that I wrote this entire burnout focus as an attempt to get quality replacements for Gary and Kathy Angell, you are mostly right on. We also still need help for the Rally and Historian positions.





Rennsport Reunion II

I had the great pleasure to make this pilgrimage to the second Rennsport Reunion and bathe myself in more Porsche race cars than one could ever imagine. 180 significant race cars and a total of 600 Porsche cars in the infield was the rumor. The web site is reporting the following personalities in attendance: Dan Gurney, Vic Elford, Hurley Haywood, Brian Redman, Jacky Ickx, Derek Bell and Bobby Rahal. I have had the pleasure to attend vintage events with major factory cars on display such as the 50 years of Porsche at Laguna Seca and expected to see something similar. I was not, however, prepared for what was waiting for me. Daytona Speedway is a large place and I was to find that heaven was spread out all over the infield.



My Friday's arrival placed me in a parking space on a grass infield lot. Upon exiting my rental car, the sounds of racing engines made me look up to see prototypes and 935s running at full song on Daytona's high banks just yards away. Daytona has many team garages and these were full of every racing Porsche one could imangine. There were, however, no roped-off display areas. We were walking next to one and all. Porsche AG Museum cars, Miles Colliers Museum cars, and private owners cars all had given us the keys to Porsche heaven. The race cars were from the early Gmünd coupes and Porsche #1 to the GT1 Evo and the 996 Cup cars. All were there with several examples deep.



Saturday was even better. It was the same parking lot experience as Friday, but new things had been added to the infield overnight. PCNA set up a display of one 911 Porsche for each year including a 911 police car that played its European siren for us throughout the day. I also found the first 902. (Look that one up if you don't know what it is.) At noon, a large group of hand picked cars were invited to line up on the pit road for a judging of authenticity. I found myself walking on this pit road next to several examples of every race car Porsche has ever made. Later there was an autograph signing, which I missed. Taking photos was my goal and, with all the cars at hand, that was a full time endeavor.

Friday and Saturday were spent qualifying and practicing so Sunday was mostly a race day. I had managed a position at the infield's eastern-most turn next to the inside barrier and settled in for the day to shoot the cars on their natural track habitat. One 935 did what I expected and came right at me at full tilt through the dirt backwards. Between the heats, we were entertained with Porsche personalities who were being interviewed over the PA.



My only regrets were: 1) I did not have a car to drive, and 2) I could not make it to everything that was happening; too many locations and too much ground to cover.


