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

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## 2011 Sonoma Historics

## Starring

## Bill Packwood

Bill Packwood is a member of the Diablo Region Porsche Club of America in California and raced his 914-6 GT at the Sonoma Historics on June 5, 2011. He was cheered on by family and Diablo members and had his brother and Frank Duran as pit crew. Here are our questions for Bill.

Q1: When and where did you buy your 914-6 GT?

A: I bought this car 25 years ago (1986) for about \$13,000. I had a 914 and saw the GT model in Panorama and talked to National PCA about kits and availability. They said "Go for it".

Q2: Have you had to do much work on it since you bought it?

A: Yes - The car was a time trial car and had a long nose and a big wing on the rear. I put about \$5,000 into the car to bring it back to the 914-6 GT look. I added 911-5 brakes, new balsa wood reinforced hood and trunks, improved roll-bar, etc.

Q3: Have you raced #53 before? If so, where?

A: I built a Chrysler-powered race car in 1960 and raced it in Pomona, Las Vegas, and Palm Springs. Then got into F-modified races in places like Santa Barbara. I got back to auto-X in the late 1970's with a 914-4. The GT car was first entered in Historics in 1998 when it was accepted into the Monterey, Wine Country, and Coronado events. I raced in all of them.





Q4 - How do you enter a car into The Sonoma Historic Races? Cost?

A: I contacted General Racing and was accepted into the race. The entry fee was \$500 to race but you also need a physical with a treadmill EKG, a seat belt and helmet less than five years old - so it ended up costing about \$2,000 to race.

- Q5: You had a lot of different kinds of sports cars on the track with you. What kinds of issues do you have to watch out for during the race?
- A: The main concern is the speed differential among the cars racing. In this race the Lotus car lapped the others so you have to watch your rear view mirror a lot. The flaggers try to help as well.



Q6: Have you driven on the Infineon track before? In the #53?

A: I have raced at Infineon many times. Time trials with Golden Gate Region, and other driver education, etc. I feel comfortable at Infineon.

Q7: How does Infineon compare to other tracks, like Laguna Seca or Thunderhill?

A: All these tracks are terrific, we are very lucky in Northern California to have so many great tracks, even Buttonwillow. Each has its own challenges, Infineon may be the most technically demanding.

Q8: Are you going to make additional changes to your 914-6 GT?

A: There are always things you want to change. I want a roll bar that is more in line with the original, and I want to add a bucket seat that is historically correct.

Q9: When is your next race?

A: Well, I am going to the Mogulaire Concours at Wente Vineyards in July but I have not washed the car since the race.

Q10: Why number 53, the Love Bug?

A: I get that question all the time but the truth is that I have used the number 53 since 1960 on all my cars and it has no relationship to the movie. Sorry.

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
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


#### The Kit covers:
