


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I had always expected to have a special photo from the 2004 Blackhawk Concours for this cover. However, as soon as Kirby Fong submitted his 7 MB photo from German AutoFest in Ventura, I knew I would succumb to my weakness for a long row of neatly organized Porsches. Palm trees or other exotic surroundings always add to the allure.

Kirby's photo makes history of a different sort as well. It was provided as in a raw, i.e., not JPEG or TIFF, format which immediately became a challenge for me and my Photoshop CS application. Fortunately, I had recently attended an Adobe Photoshop User Group session on handling the raw format and had the Adobe Camera Raw Plug-in installed and so was only slightly intimidated. The biggest single problem is getting the original size down to what can be maneuvered on your screen. It is very hard to do anything with an image that is larger than a 17 inch screen.

Kirby used his Canon EOD Digital Rebel 300D set as follows: ISO 200, 1/800, f/7.1, and 44 mm. The size was 3072 x 2048 at 240 dpi.

l am extremely pleased to have such a fine photo for our newslet-ter.

PCA National has switched from home-grown membership system to one developed at a pro level and currently used by the BMW equivilent to PCA. Many challenges lie ahead and whomever takes over the membership role from Judy will have the satisfaction of contributing some creative solutions to forthcoming needs.

If I did not have this very demanding editor job, I would look forward to tweaking on the new system and developing a whole new set of contact manager solutions. I have, in fact, downloaded a demo contact manager plug-in for FileMaker 7 Pro.

Finally, there is a need for some housekeeping details. It appears that as many as 50% of our membership have items that need correcting or updating in our new database. For example, many of you became members before e-mail became so widely used and thus no e-mail is listed for you. When I became the membership chairperson three or so years ago, the list had no category for e-mail addresses whereas now around 95% of current new members submit an e-mail address. The new system collects more data on your Porsche, e.g., model, year, color, and body, but many of you still list your original Porsche rather the one you are currently driving.

# ALMS: 2004

Monterey, California, October 16, 2004, German Porsche driver Timo Bernhard, along with co-driver Jorg Bergmeister, led the four-hour Audi Sports Car Championships GT class for three hours and 47 minutes before giving up the race lead, but their second-place finish was enough to give Bernhard the 2005 American Le Mans Series GT Drivers Championship.

Bernhard, who would have shared the title with Bergmeister if Jorg hadn't been ill at the first event of the year (Sebring), won the title in front of his mother, who was visiting the United States for the first time. "The car was perfect all day, which it had to be to stay ahead of the Flying Lizard Porsche, which, with its third place finish, would have won the title if we had broken," said Bernhard, who won five races and finished second twice in the nine-race ALMS season en route to the title.

"We came into the pits during the late rain shower to change tires under the green flag, giving up the lead to our team car–Dumas/Lieb, but it was the right thing to do to preserve our chance for the championship," said Bernhard, who was the Porsche Carrera Cup champion in Germany as part of the Porsche UPS Junior team before joining Alex Job Racing.



"Jorg and Timo were faster in the dry conditions, but we stayed close and took advantage of their green flag pit stop to take the win. We are pleased for the #24 Alex Job pit crew, who worked so hard

all year to get us into the winners circle," said Lieb With their victory, Dumas and Lieb vaulted into fourth placed in the final point standings.



It was their second victory of the season. as they topped the GT field at Portland as well. Third was the #45 Flying Lizard Porsche of Johannes van Overbeek and Darren Law, which had an outside chance to win the title, but fell short by 18 points. Still, Law was pleased with the season-long success the team achieved. 'With the third place finish today, we finished on the podium in eight of the nine ALMS events, and Johannes and I are very proud of everyone on the Flying Lizard Motorsport team," said Law. We gave the Alex Job team, with its four factory drivers, good competition right to the last lap, and second place in the final standings is rewarding for everyone," said Law. Fourth was the Kelleners/Lazarro/De Simone Ferrari. followed by the Cort Wagner/Patrick Long The Racer's Group Porsche and the David Murry/Craig Stanton Petersen/White Lightning Porsche. The top ten drivers in the final ALMS GT standings were all Porsche 911 GT3 RSR competitors.

# Alex Job Racing: ALMS

Alex Job Racing is the only team to run the entire ALMS schedule every year since the inception of the series. Alex Job driver Cort Wagner won the driver's title in 1999, but Job lost the team championship to BMW's Tom Milner. In 2000, with Randy Pobst and Bruno Lambert at the helm, Alex Job Porsche won two ALMS races, with Pobst in contention for the drivers title until the last event. Alex Job Racing has now won the 2002, 2003, and 2004 GT Team Championships.

Alex and wife Holly Job started the team in 1990 after Alex decided to end his driving career. His best finish as a driver was second in class at the 1990 Rolex 24 at Daytona. Most well known for thorough preparation and innovative endurance racing strategy for the five of the six years ALMS has been running, Job has been the team chosen by the Porsche factory and Porsche Motorsport North America to utilize its contract drivers for the ALMS series. Dick Barbour Racing had the factory drivers in 2000, and Alex Job Racing hosted them in 1999.



## What I Did This Summer: London & Saumur

Think of the great names in the automotive world. The individuals whose automobiles not only provide a level of performance that is second to none, but do so with a style and panache that other designers can only dream of. Their cars approach automotive perfection: Ettore Bugatti, Enzo Ferrari, Ferdinand Porsche. To that list of icons, add Peter Sontag. He and his company, Fast Lane Travel, don't craft automobiles. They craft adventures for people who are passionate about automobiles.

Peter has been in the travel business on a grand scale for over 35 years. That has paid the bills quite nicely, but his personal mission has been to create and execute the perfect adventure for the discerning automobile enthusiast. This past June, my wife and I were one of six couples who traveled with Fastlane to experience Peter's latest attempt to achieve perfection. We were one of four couples who were first-timers, but this was the 18th trip for one couple, and the 5th for another. Ostensibly, the trip was to go to the 24 Hours of Le Mans, but it was so much more. To wit:

On Sunday night, we left the states for London, arriving on Monday morning. The trip officially began when we were met at the airport and driven to the Le Meridien Grosvenor Hotel, the first of several 5-star accommodations. After a free afternoon, we had dinner with a Lord-appointed, not inherited-at The Reform Club, a very private British club. The dinner began outside in a garden with drinks and hors d'oeuvres; it ended it with cigars and brandy (or in my case, port). In between, we ate dinner, heard stories and recollections both historic and current, asked numerous questions, and enjoyed the company of a "veddy, veddy" British and delightful Right Honorable Doctor the Lord Gilbert. Although he asked that we just address him as "John," "Lord Gilbert" was more comfortable.

Tuesday morning, we toured the hightech Williams F-1 Museum–as modern as tomorrow as they say. Juxtaposed in the afternoon was the Aston Martin factory, where there is a mill on the grounds that was built in 1066.

The tours were sandwiched around lunch at a pub, The Woodstock Arms, that defines the term "quaint." Although we weren't allowed to drive anything at the Williams museum, we each did get to drive an Aston Martin Volante briefly-top down, right-hand drive, wrong side of the road.

Wednesday was a free day. We did some sightseeing and shopping (Harrods's, the Purdey & Sons gunmakers), with the day ending with yet another wonderful dinner at Peter's favorite London pub, The Red Lion, and then to a play. Our four couples saw "Grease" (nothing like going to England to see a play about an American high school), while two couples saw "Bombay Dreams," and one couple went to see "Chicago."

Thursday, we flew from London to Nantes, France. On the way from the airport to our hotel, we stopped for lunch at a winery in Saumur. Bruno Paumard, an international celebrity sommelier, hosted our group for lunch. He explained quite poetically how the soil creates the grape, and grape in turn creates the wine. He humbly minimized his own importance. We enjoyed hearing about, and tasting, the differences between red, white, and sparkling wines. We experienced how each wine tasted with different foods. Lunch ended with Bruno showing us the proper way to use a saber to remove the cork from a bottle of sparkling wine. We also toured the catacombs that are cut back into the hillside where the wines are stored to age, and saw the wine being bottled and labeled. We gained a new regard for the artistry that is involved in the making of a fine wine. And it is a very fine wine indeed!

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

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






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
