

Changing any one of the many, many communication, navigation, entertainment, suspension, climate, lighting, etc., systems in a car these days can be dangerous at any speed. Legislators mistakenly focus on cell phone conversations and texting, as if they are the only vices out there behind the wheel. Look at the dash and center console of any modern car (including the new Porsches) and you can see there are many other built-in opportunities to do something other than drive the car. A good track day, like we just had, helps your brain focus on what real driving is all about. On public roads, I spend most of my time trying to anticipate what others are about to do and see if it affects my planned path. I think they call that defensive driving.





So, we have this huge, open parking lot at a premier US racetrack, a bunch of cones and some fast

cars. Think we can have some fun with that???

At Infineon...Thursday, May 17th, we team up with Hooked On Driving who are running their HPDE event on the track that day...David Ray and his team have graciously offered us the opportunity of a Car Control and Track Experience event in the paddock while their event is in progress.

You will be able to (urged to) turn the traction control (PSM) off! Even if you run on track, you may not know what happens when you brake so hard the ABS kicks in, or corner so hard that the back end breaks away, or you try and turn a fast left/right/left. It's useful to find out. You never know when someone will do the unexpected in front of you on the freeway, or on any other road – and that's not the time to learn!

When I bought my first Porsche in the UK, in early 1994 (a 1988 Carrera Targa Sport), the dealership offered time with a Porsche driving consultant as part of the package. We went to the skid pad, and I learned what happens when you go hard into a turn and lift off the gas suddenly. That was the first time I also learned the simple mnemonic - 'in a spin, two in' (feet on brake and clutch!). But after a few attempts I was power-sliding.

Generally, I was amazed at how tenaciously the tires would cling to asphalt even when you were circling like a madman in search of a lost donut – and when it did break free, things happened fast, the notorious Carrera snap, (these days mitigated by 20 more years of development), as the rear end whipped suddenly the other way – in those days, out-of-control Porsches would go off the road on the inside of a bend!

Then I also learned, in those pre-ABS days, that under very hard braking in a 3.2 Carrera, you could turn the steering wheel lock to lock and still go in a straight line...

In the Car Control event at Infineon, you will have the opportunity to find out what your car does when you push it too far – but only if you want to - just enjoy driving more enthusiastically than you do in 'real

life' – whatever you are comfortable with and is fun for you! Diablo Club members, plus one SO or immediate family member are welcome to register (must be over 18 with current license) – you do not need to bring a Porsche, although we do not allow any SUV's apart from Cayenne's.

The day will start off with a short check-in and driver's meeting at 9am to pass on some tips on how to get the most from it. (By the way, if you want to come earlier (7.55am) to sit-in on the Hooked On Driving drivers meeting for the track day, you are welcome.

First up will be a Threshold Braking exercise – accelerating to a predetermined point at a set speed, then throwing out the anchors hard to stop in a box of cones...as you circulate through the exercises, you will get tips from coaches who will be observing your progress. Next we will have a cornering exercise, a big figure eight which will require hard cornering - and some skidding if you want to push it harder. After that we will have lunch and can meet up with our fellow members who are driving the track.

From mid-morning onwards, you will get a couple of demo laps on Infineon with Hooked On Driving coaches (limited to one per participant in car control). Also, should you want a break, you'll be able to spectate the track event from many spectacular vantage points which Infineon has to offer.

Third, after lunch we will have a slalom course set up. When a car's handling is tested, you often see a slalom course - a series of turns through the cones where throttle and steering play in concert to keep the car's balance throughout the turns...you'll be amazed at what your car can do.

Of course, in any of these exercises – there will be nothing to hit if you get it wrong – there will only be cones, which won't hurt your car. (You can always put some painter's tape on the edges of the car if you are unsure – it goes on and comes off very easily without leaving any marks – I'll bring some along).

These exercises will run for over an hour each so you will have several 'circuits' and breaks in between, we'll finish about 3.30pm. To sign up see the flyer in this issue – it's only \$50 including lunch, limited to 30 places.

Diablo Club members who want to run the Hooked On Driving track day will get a discount on the registration fee (see the flier elsewhere in this issue). However, you won't be able to do both events as they run concurrently.

Talking of track days, we had a great time at Thunderhill on March 16th, with a large turnout at Safety Inspections in Fremont Porsche and Kahler's. With a 'dodgy' weather forecast which caused several last-minute cancellations, on the day, the micro-climate around Thunderhill worked in our favor to be mostly dry – just one session was run in rain. In all, 59 people drove, instructed, helped or spectated. It was a 100% clean day - there were no incidents. Thanks everyone, for turning out...particularly those who came out to help and did not drive!

Thanks also to Fremont Porsche for sponsoring the day – your support is greatly appreciated by our membership.

Soon we will be announcing more events to complement the existing arrangement at Thunderhill on 10/29. If the Car Control/Track Experience day is a success, we can certainly make it a more regular feature.



Rally School and Rally --- Getting Ready for Salt Lake City

Preparations are underway to present a rally school on Sunday, April 15th for those interested in learning about TSD (time-speed-distance) rallying. The TSD rally is one of the competitive events that you can compete in at the Porsche Parade in July in Salt Lake City. The rules allow for 4 classes so you pick the one that is appropriate to your car's equipment (navigational systems move you up in class — even if you don't even know how to turn it on).

The rally school will be held at Porsche of Livermore. This provides for a central location for most of the PCA members in Zone 7. We want to thank Diablo Region for working with us (Sacramento Valley Region) to host these events. This event is open to all PCA members and to the public. PCA members receive priority. Fees for the school and the rally have not yet been finalized.

We will have a 2-hour classroom session in the morning, followed by a lunch break, and then an opportunity to put your newly acquired skills to the test on an actual rally in the afternoon. You can attend both or either one.

We will meet at Porsche of Livermore, 3100 Las Positas Road, Livermore, CA. 94551, 925.447.6400. Registration time has not yet been finalized but should be before 10 am.

We do ask that you RSVP to Rik Larson (see info below) so that we can have adequate space and printed materials. This applies to both events. We will use the 2012 Porsche Parade TSD Rally General Instructions (assuming they are available at the time of the school) as a reference for the school and the rally.

There is a <u>follow-up rally techniques session</u> planned for Sunday, July 1. It will be held at Niello Porsche in Rocklin. More information on that later.

The Macan

From Porsche AG

Stuttgart. Dr. Ing. h.c. F. Porsche AG,

Stuttgart's new sports car in the SUV segment has been given the name Macan. The name Macan is derived from the Indonesian word for tiger and combines suppleness, power, fascination and dynamics – core characteristics of the new off-road car.

"The Macan combines all sports car characteristics with the benefits of a SUV and is a genuine Porsche", said Bernhard Maier, Executive Vice President Sales and Marketing of Porsche AG. "The name of a new Porsche has to fit with the brand, sound good in very many languages and dialects and evoke positive associations.

"As the fifth Porsche model line, the Macan is a central plank of Strategy 2018, by which the sports car manufacturer wishes to expand its model portfolio. Porsche intends the Macan to emulate the success of the Cayenne. The SUV will start coming off the production lines in Leipzig in 2013. To that end, the site in this city in Saxony is being expanded into a fully-fledged production plant including body assembly line and paint shop - with 500 million euro of investment one of the biggest building projects in Porsche's corporate history. In the medium-term, the sports car manufacturer will be creating more than 1000 new jobs here.

Word names at Porsche have a concrete connection with the corresponding model and its characteristics: the name Boxster describes the combination of boxer engine and roadster, Cayenne stands for sharpness, the Cayman is snappy and agile and a Panamera is more than a Gran Tourismo, capable also of winning the Carrera Panamericana long-distance race.
