

Ron for the Road

In a recent Director's meeting, mention was made of wine being given as part of a concours trophy. This reminded me of a prized champagne bottle that stands with some of my trophies in my living room. If you squint and look closely, the Porsche crest and the familiar Porsche script make up the label. I was one of 80 Porsche factory visitors who had a new Porsche delivered





(see the glacier blue '84 Carrera pictured in the January '05 edition of this column) at one time in the large Ludwigsburg back lot. A UPI photographer filmed the happening from a tall ladder and the 80 Porsche champagne bottles were distributed.

As I write these words, my January Advocate has not yet arrived via the mail. I have the box of extra copies from UPS, but bulk mail can be slow. I will explain (again!) some reasons for this latest delay, and suggest a work-around or remedy. I strongly suggest that the each Diablo Region household download the color newsletter PDF which is available weeks earlier than the mailed uncolored version. The Super Bowl ad looks so much better in red, white and blue and you will not miss the February 6 date because of a late-arriving newsletter. You can navigate to the current edition download by starting at the homepage URL shown on the bottom right or by going to the Diablo web page (bottom right on page three).

As for the delays, they were mostly holiday related. Both our printer and our new mailer were closed down for four December days during the time of the month that is most crucial for getting the *Advocate* printed and mailed. When holiday vacations combine with weekends, delays can be substantial. An editor is mostly helpless when copy arrives after the deadline, e.g., this month "Tidbits" was due on 11th and arrived at 6:20 PM of the 17th, and when delays occur after the production people get their press copy.

As an example of my effort to keep the newsletter on time, it is now 7:15 AM and I have been working at this computer since 4:00 AM. I will stop for today, however, since I do have a demanding regular job.

One of the criticisms of this newsletter is that the photos, although numerous, are frequently rather small and may be hard to see easily. This proliferation of photos is certainly part of my editorial philosophy. I want to show as many members and their Porsches as possible but doing so can be complicated. We reduced the page size to lower costs, but boosted the costs back beyond the prior level with quality glossy paper and plate printing. The combination of much better paper and printing does show off our digital images very well, but the price is cramped pages and relatively small image size.

I have also chosen to give less space to identifying the people in the photos and the chit-chat that could also accompany



many of the photos. This one of two of our esteemed Directors is clearly a candidate for some gossippy chit-chat sort of caption, but I will not go there at this time. Since identifying photos is a standard by which newsletters are judged in national PCA newsletter competition, I have no plans to have the *Advocate* enter such competition.


