





power, and a very modern interior. It corners very flat, rides well, and I still like the PDK. A 15 minute drive with a dozen left and right turns is not enough to get a complete feel, just a teaser. There are many factory options for suspension etc., that make it possible to customize the car to different driving interests. This car gives you even more "fun" buttons on the consol to customize any drive to your current mood. I think this is a good thing. A GT commute/ grocery getter one day and a back roads/track car the next. Looks to me like the new model may be able to do both of these tasks better than any previous 911 variant. In fact, I can't think of any other car that can do so many different things (that is things we are interested in) this well. How Porsche is that!!



Today, I saw a Cayman

It seems a million miles away...not just

5,300. I'm in the UK, the country I lived in until just under 14 years ago. The weather is grey – nothing new there. And in the small market town where I grew up, on the borders of Wales, little has changed.

But, the cars - they have changed. Picking up my Hertz rental at the airport, the guy at the counter explained that it was a Mitsubishi ASX. Oh really? What's that? He didn't know the color, telling me to 'press the remote and look for the lights to flash'. Not so easy, because when I emerged into the (unmanned) rental car lot, there were three long lines of cars, of many makes and colors yet very similar looking models. It was raining very hard and I was dragging a suitcase across the wet asphalt. Tired, jet lagged, hungry and increasingly desperate, I walked the lines clicking the remote like a lost Star Trek character when his 'beam me up' fails.

After two days here, I still don't recognize any of the cars apart from the BMW's. Absolutely none! Despite the badge on the front, they all seem to be from the same mold. On the 60 mile drive from the airport, even on the motorway, I didn't see any I knew. At least they don't seem to suffer the 'any color you like as long as it's grey' Bay Area preferences. In fact, looking out of my window at the hotel parking lot I see green, blue, white, red, silver, gold, black and many shades of each. In such grey weather at least the cars have some color! Then today I saw a Cayman. It was Black....Looking ahead to bright spots, we have a Laguna Seca date – November 19th. I know it's later in the year but Monterey is always sunny isn't it? Many people have told me that they would love to drive that track and although they really like Thunderhill, they would be really excited if Diablo could run there too.

So with that, and Thunderhill on October 29th, it will be a fun last quarter of 2012 for the Club's DE program. With just three weeks between events, it gives the opportunity to get warmed-up at Thunderhill on a classic training track then, take it to Laguna Seca's

slightly more challenging turns.

Regular running is the key to building skills on track, as any experienced drivers will tell you. You get used to the higher speeds and the handing of your car, of thinking faster and anticipating better.

Talking of car 'handling', it was disappointing but necessary to cancel our car control clinic. However, we are committed to looking for a venue which works and there are several under consideration in the Bay Area.

One thing it did tell us, the event will be popular when it happens. Over three weeks out, we were already well over half way to our limit of 30 registered.

We held a meeting for the 'DE Team' a couple of weeks ago and I would like to thank the 15 members who attended for their feedback, support and continuing help with the program. 2012 and the Diablo DE Program are shaping up well.



Rally School Wrap Up By Kathy Soler

Special thanks to the Sacramento Region, especially Rik Larsen and Richard Whetzel and all the good people that came to help, for holding a TSD Rally School on Sunday April 15^{th} at Porsche of Livermore. (TSD = Time, speed and distance)

With the Porsche Parade coming this way in the next year or so and Rallies being a big part of the event, it's time we learned how to run them. Do we have any Rally Masters in the Diablo Region? I never had the pleasure of meeting John Clever, but Rik and Richard knew him quite well as John was big into rallies here in Diablo. We've lost touch with Rallies in recent years and it was interesting to learn how they work and then to actually participate on one.

We had a classroom set up in the shop area of Livermore Porsche and there was plenty of time for questions and answers. There were sample route instructions (RI in rally speak) to help us get an idea of what we would be up against. There is a whole glossary of rally terms to remember and for your Navigator to have handy just in case something comes up on the drive and you need to refer to them. Rallies are usually made up of eight legs with each individual leg timed and scored. One participant associated Rallies with doing a puzzle and she was right, some route instructions can be tricky so you have to pay close attention.

After a few hours learning rally terms and discussing possible rally directions, we set out to Rally. The morning had been overcast but by the time we were ready to go, the sun was shining and it was a beautiful day. Each car was registered and given their vehicle number.

You need a driver and a navigator for each vehicle, preferably two people that get along quite well. Everyone lined up and was given their RI and each vehicle left the dealership at one minute intervals. We set out first to warm up our tires for several miles and then several more miles to do an odometer check. You need to know whether your odometer is faster, slower or right on with the Rally

Master's odometer. If you are faster or slower, you must adjust your speed and timing to help keep you right on track for the optimum time for each leg of the rally. The odometer check helps get you started on keeping track of your mileage and get in practice at resetting the odometer.

Our RI took us out North Livermore Road and into the Livermore back roads out towards Tracy and the windmills. We looped around a few times and ended up on Greenville Road and found our check points. Our rally was made up of four legs and took a few hours. After the final check point we headed to Round Table Pizza in Livermore to await the results. People rolled in and filled out their scorecards and then the folks from Sacramento did the Audit. Times were all over the place but fun was had by all.

What equipment do you need? You need a good clock/watch that shows hours, minutes and seconds and a working odometer and speedometer. Oh and by the way, since Rallies always require a driver and navigator, you need someone to perform the navigator function.

Thank you to Livermore Porsche for providing the venue, coffee, fruit, donuts, sandwiches and drinks.

"60 Years of Porsche Clubs" Special Exhibition in the Porsche Museum from 26 May to 26 August 2012

Stuttgart. For six decades, the history of Dr. Ing. h.c. F. Porsche AG, Stuttgart, has been inseparably associated with the worldwide enthusiasm of the Porsche Club scene. 60 years ago, on 26 May 1952, seven passionate Porsche drivers founded the Porsche Club Hohensyburg in Westphalia. According to its articles of association, the common goal of this first club was to "unite all Porsche drivers in friendship and comradeship". The creation of this first club was the foundation stone for a long and unique success story that has become a global phenomenon.

In the early Fifties, it was still a rarity to encounter a Porsche on the open road. This resulted in a greater sense of solidarity between owners – not just in Germany. The Porsche Clubs' international success story begins in 1953 with the founding of the Porsche Club Belgium. Two years later a private group of American Porsche customers, who were providing one another with technical support, spawned the Porsche Club of America, which nowadays represents the largest Porsche Club organization in the world. And in 1961, in Great Britain, enthusiasts of the Zuffenhausen sports car brand founded the Porsche Club Great Britain, which has now developed into the largest Porsche Club organization in Europe. Today, the 640 officially recognized Porsche Clubs with their approximately 181,000 members from more than 75 countries constitute the world's largest automotive sector brand club.

The Porsche Clubs live the Porsche brand, seven days a week and 365 days a year. Club members' high voluntary commitment makes them important brand ambassadors and thus part and parcel of the Porsche brand. That is why the Porsche Museum is honoring the Clubs' 60th anniversary with a special exhibition. From 26 May to 26 August 2012, the sports car manufacturer will be looking back on six decades replete with exciting club activities. Not only will Club members' special vehicles be on show but special photographs, documents and small exhibits will also relate their personal stories and experiences.

In addition, all museum visitors will be invited to select the most beautiful exhibit as part of a "Concours d'Elegance". The choice is between twelve different vehicles, including the twelfth Porsche 356 produced in Zuffenhausen, a Porsche 968 Turbo S and a Porsche 911 Turbo Targa. Dr. Wolfgang Porsche as well will be providing a rare vehicle from his private collection for the special exhibition: a 911 Turbo S (993). Moreover, a 1970 Porsche 914/6 GT will be on show, as will a Porsche 911 S "Club Coupé" that was brought out in a limited edition of 50 units exclusively for American Club members to mark the 50th anniversary of the Porsche Club of America.

The museum shop will be offering a selection of special items for sale: the new volume "60 years of Porsche Clubs" by in-house publisher "Edition Porsche Museum" introduces the reader to the history of the Porsche Clubs in approximately 180 pages. The book acquaints the reader with the most interesting, beautiful and spectacular Club moments. The book is available in German and English for 14.90 euro. Also, the museum shop is offering a metal "grill badge" on the occasion of the Clubs' 60th anniversary – that can be affixed to the air intake grille on historic Porsche models. The "grill badge" is approximately 95 millimetres in diameter and costs 35.00 euro. An anniversary pin is also available, priced at 5.00 euro.

The Porsche Museum is open Tuesday to Sunday from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. Admission is eight euro for adults and four euro for concessions. There is free admission for children under the age of 14, accompanied by an adult. Additional information is available online: www.porsche.com/museum.
