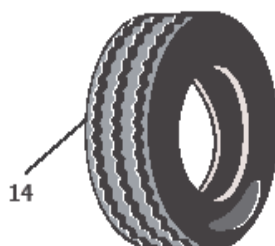
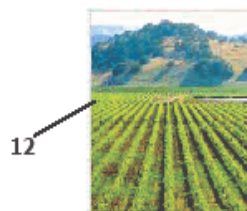

Jeff is a very familiar face in local track events and regularly instructs at GGR, Coastal Driving School, Hooked On Driving and has

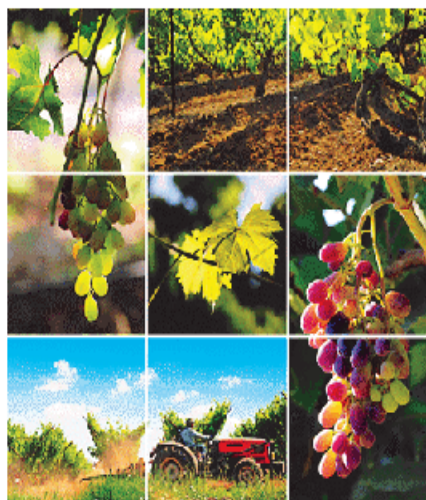

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Getting a Grip on Tires

It was a cold rainy Saturday in November as I polished off another fine omelet at the Buttercup. I overheard Lillie and Eugenie mention they needed tires and were wondering what to get. I said, "Yeah I'm due for a set myself for the Cayman too. I'm thinking about getting a set of PS2's." (Lillie and Eugenie have Cayman cars as well) They said, "Oh tell us more." Too Late! I couldn't stop. It was just blah blah blah from me. Carlos leaned over and said "why don't you do a group buy and ask around?" Naively I said. "OK".

I had NO IDEA what I was in for. I thought, 'I'll just gather a few requirements and it will be done in 2-3 weeks'. Looking back I should have thought in months not weeks. I put the tire buy to rest over the winter and thought 'we'll just spin it up in early spring'. As we roll into July, we are now down to the last 8 installs. Like I said naïve.

With Doug Wiebe and Luis Soler's help, we sent out the announcements via email blast for the tire buy. I was braced for a flood of responses. I'd like to say there was overwhelming response, but I would be lying. I got two responses. We continued to send out email blasts and announcements. Like clockwork two new people every time. Doug, are you busy? What does it take to send it out every other day? Maybe that's pushing it. I'll just use the time to gather up businesses that may be interested in putting in a bid. I said to myself, "Ok, let's gather up what the needs are and start forming a list. Let me get to the first batch." WOW! It's all over the place what people want and don't want. As I look across my home office to the hanging electronic dartboard, I thought 'too bad I don't have a picture of Carlos'. I'm just joking Carlos.

Let's just jot it all down; it'll come together. Lucky for me, a theme started to emerge-most folks wanted Saturday service. At least it's a start and gives me something to tell the businesses. I started with 7 and then arrived to a final

4 with one dropping out when we started talking price and service.

In early March, my monster awakened and had a life of its own. We were now up to 30 buyers and starting to get into the realities of real world supply, price and consumer preference. I was no longer in full control, I can guide it and that was about it. But when Doug asked how the tire buy was going I wasn't about to respond, "Well.. I'll have the monster back in the cage in a few days." It was a lot of work for myself to gather the requests and keep them brief to turn over to the businesses for quotes. I realize what a drag I was in asking for the businesses to put together a quote, who at this point didn't know if they were even getting the business yet. I am truly grateful for their time to put the numbers together. Our buyers were very pleased with the numbers presented as well and many replied with encouragement and gratitude to the businesses.

I learned a lot from this experience, while it was a lot of work to get started, it paid me back many times with satisfaction and contact with all of our wonderful members. There were many buyers who came forward who I didn't know. I got to know many of them through the tire buy and look forward to meeting more of them in our future events. I have met a few in person already and missed one at Wash N Shine (Sorry Jeff Kreutzer). Thanks for coming out to DE101 Bobbie Goodwin. The list goes on and on. Thank



you everyone that participated, you all made the experience very rewarding for me.

So what actually happened with the Tire Buy? After careful consideration, we went with Michael Stead Porsche's proposal. The numbers went up and down until we locked the order in at 48 sets of tires. The brand most requested was Michelin by a wide margin. The lowest price per tire was for an Acura CL and the highest was for a Cayenne GTS. The total value of the tires alone was over \$50K. While the savings were variable, the buyers all agreed it was good deal for them. Already folks are asking about the next one. We'll have to look in to it later.



As we wrap up the tire buy I like to say a special thank you to Eric Schaefer, Melissa Jones and Eric Lynds at Michael Stead Porsche for all their

hard work and excellent service to our members. Many buyers have emailed us to let us know how pleased they were with your service!

Last mentioned, but certainly not last is the winner of the free set of N spec tires. Thank you Eric S. for arranging this. Drum roll....The winner was... Jim Kruse. I had the pleasure of meeting Jim in person last week and he came out to breakfast at Mimi's today.

All these options plus the pleasure of a great drive and the camaraderie of fellow Porsche PCA members! What more could you ask for???



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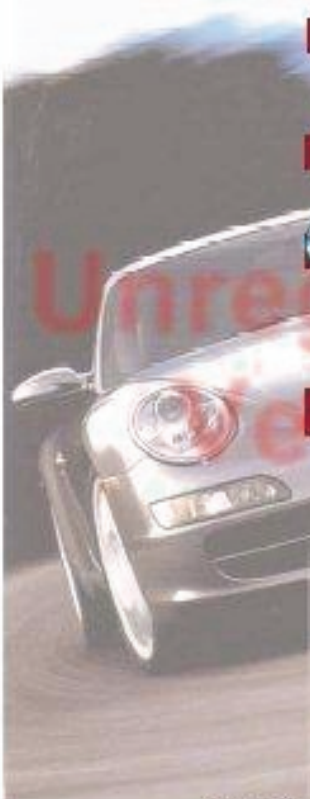


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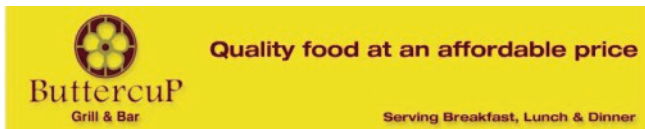

Tri-Valley Saturday Breakfast

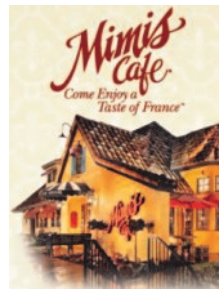

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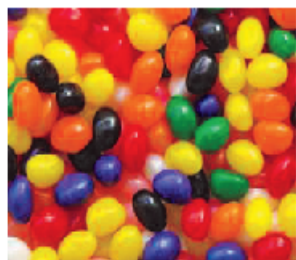

Meet Chris Fortich



1. What first interested you in Porsche?

I became interested in Porsche as a young boy who constantly read Road & Track magazine. I loved the combination of great styling and impressive performance. My older cousin had an early 914-4 in orange. I remember he would take me on rides and occasionally hit 100mph. From then on I was hooked on the brand.

2. What was your first Porsche and why did you purchase it?

My father and I bought a 1965 912 while I was in high school. We rebuilt most of it ourselves and we were able to get it in good enough running condition for me to drive it to my senior prom. 912's are a great combination between a late 356 and an early 911. I guess you could say they are hybrids of the two models.

3. What are your interests (hobbies)?

Formula 1, LeMans, MotoGP, photography, industrial design, SF Giants, SF 49ers, and trying to find the next best sushi restaurant.

4. What type of work do you do and if you are retired, what did you do?

I'm a licensed insurance agent. I help families protect their assets and secure their retirement accounts through life insurance and fixed index annuities.

5. What is your current Porsche?

I still have the 1965 912 and I have a 2008 Cayman S Sport Limited Edition #532 of 700 made

6. What do you like about your Porsche?

Although it is a newer model, with plenty of amenities, the Cayman still feels like a classic sports car. The mid engine layout allows for great weight distribution and the steering response is absolutely wonderful on Northern California back roads.

7. **What options do you wish it included?**
I'm a big fan of Alcantara. I wish it had an Alcantara headliner and lower dash.
8. **Is this your daily driver and if not, when do you drive it?**
It's not my daily driver. I usually drive it on weekends. I really should drive it more since I only have 6500 miles since new.
9. **What type of driving do you like to do (i.e. spirited, country winding roads, long interstate trips)?**
I like taking drives on country winding roads, especially Hwy 9 and Redwood Road from Castro Valley to Moraga.
10. **What activities do you enjoy doing with the Diablo Region?**
I enjoy the DE events. It's a great chance to see the true capabilities of a Porsche.
11. **Is there any particular event that stands out as most enjoyable?**
My first DE event last March at Thunderhill stands out. I was worried about the forecast of rain. Fortunately it only drizzled during one session, which added an excellent variable to the DE learning curve. I think the drive home in the torrential storm was more dangerous than the actual DE event. Cruising on highways 680 and 580 in the slow lane at 35mph due to standing water was quite an experience.
12. **Is there any activity the Diablo Region does not provide that you would like to do?**
I can't think of any, but I'm definitely excited for the DE event at Laguna Seca in November.
13. **If you could have any Porsche, what would it be and why?**
This is a tough one. The Carrera GT or the 997.2 GT3RS come to mind, but I'd have go with a 1965 356 SC Cabriolet in Slate Gray with red leather interior and a black top. The '65 is the last iteration of that model and I think it would be a fun car to drive as well as great investment.

Election Time is Right Around the Corner

My how time flies! July is the month our Nomination Committee begins looking for candidates to run for the Diablo Board of Directors. The Committee Chair is Ingrid Plooy. The election is held in October with the elected individuals beginning their **2 year** terms in January.

There are five (5) openings on the Board for 2013. As a reminder, members run to join the Board, not for any particular position. In December, the new Board meets and votes who will fill the Officer positions (President, Vice-President, Treasurer and Secretary). The remaining Directors will serve as Directors-at-Large.

A position on the Board is voluntary and it does require some time and responsibility commitment. The amount of time commitment depends on the actual position held, but there is a minimum expectation. 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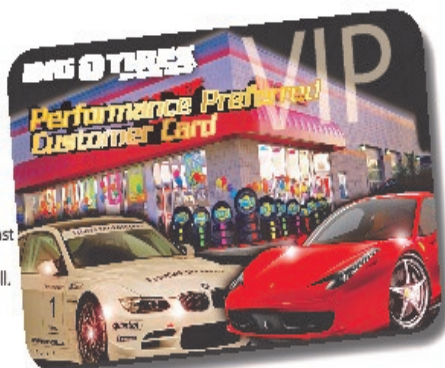

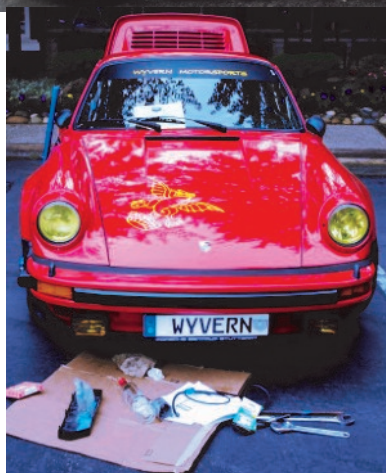

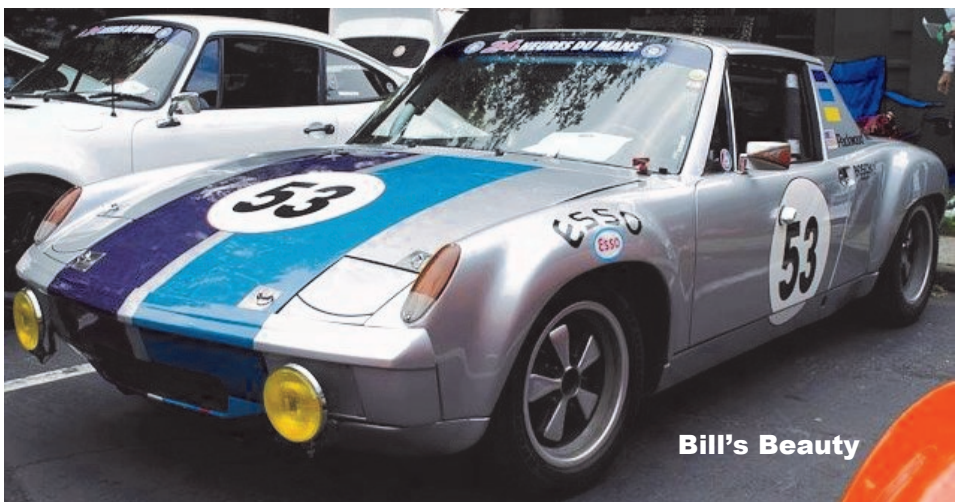
