Rally School and Rally --- Getting Ready for Salt Lake City

Preparations are underway to present a rally school on Sunday, April 15th for those interested in learning about TSD (time-speed-distance) rallying. The TSD rally is one of the competitive events that you can compete in at the Porsche Parade in July in Salt Lake City. The rules allow for 4 classes so you pick the one that is appropriate to your car's equipment (navigational systems move you up in class — even if you don't even know how to turn it on).

The rally school will be held at Porsche of Livermore. This provides for a central location for most of the PCA members in Zone 7. We want to thank Diablo Region for working with us (Sacramento Valley Region) to host these events. This event is open to all PCA members and to the public. PCA members receive priority. Fees for the school and the rally have not yet been finalized.

We will have a 2-hour classroom session in the morning, followed by a lunch break, and then an opportunity to put your newly acquired skills to the test on an actual rally in the afternoon. You can attend both or either one.

We will meet at Porsche of Livermore, 3100 Las Positas Road, Livermore, CA. 94551, 925.447.6400. Registration time has not yet been finalized but should be before 10 am.

We do ask that you RSVP to Rik Larson (see info below) so that we can have adequate space and printed materials. This applies to both events. We will use the 2012 Porsche Parade TSD Rally General Instructions (assuming they are available at the time of the school) as a reference for the school and the rally.

There is a <u>follow-up rally techniques session</u> planned for Sunday, July 1. It will be held at Niello Porsche in Rocklin. More information on that later.

As I write this, our Thunderhill event on 3/16 is taking shape and it's exciting to see it out on motorsportreg.com – the registration process will open in a few days.

In 2012, we are making some changes based upon member feed-back. These include **limiting the day to 60 participants** (and we will contain all run groups below 25 cars). We already have a number of sign-ups from our Christmas Voucher offer, plus we have many enthusiastic members planning to attend – so we are keeping a tally. The good news is we are up to 40 already...so when registration opens, please don't hold back. And feel free to contact me at DEChair@diablo-pca.org with any questions.

Why limit entries? Well, when we surveyed members last year, you told us you wanted plenty of track space and track time. We listened...how about $\mathbf{5} \times \mathbf{30}$ minute sessions? That's our schedule for all three groups.

We also heard members like making new friends and catching up with old ones...so we will are providing that opportunity over a group **lunch**, in **the Clubhouse**, included in **the general registration fee**. Anyone who has been to Thunderhill lately will tell you the food is good – although quality seemed to drop early in 2010, all is well now.


At the track we'll have GotBlueMilk photography providing prints or CDs of the day. So be sure to visit them in their trailer and take home a souvenir photo of you, in your car, at the track. Dito takes excellent driving action photographs - take a look at some of his work online at www.gotbluemilk.com

When you get to the track, we have a **streamlined check-in and safety inspection process** which will mean you have plenty of time to prepare before the Driver's Meeting. For those coming up early, **we will offer night-before check-in too.**

If you are staying the night before, phone the hotels in Willows rather than booking on-line. Some offer lower rates if you tell them you are going to the track.

We will start the day off with 10-12 minutes of track 'Cruise' laps strictly held to 40 mph maximum and no passing. This gives everyone the opportunity to see the conditions on the day and get acquainted (or re-acquainted) with the turns at low speed. As an ex-motorcycle rider, I value looking closely at the track surface before I start pressing a vehicle to perform on it. Most importantly, new drivers tell us they value the opportunity to see the track, for the first time, in more relaxed format.

We have safety inspections scheduled at Fremont Porsche on 3/3 from 9am – 1pm and at Kahlers on 3/6 from 6.00pm – 8.30pm. As you may know, National PCA standards call for all cars to be

inspected by an approved person within 30 days of the event. In reality these are also sociable functions where we all get to meet and chat over pizza or bagels. Even if you are not coming to Thunderhill on 3/16, you might like to drop in, get your car a free inspection and meet the team – after all, it's just as important that our cars are safe on public roads as anywhere else!

Finally, my thanks to the Diablo DE Team who have helped provide ideas for improvements to the program and put up with my questions over the last few months as we talked about how we provide uniquely enjoyable events at low prices, with the highest safety standards and quality instruction.
