### Avenue of the Giants Tour by Kim and Debi Jacobsen

This was our first tour with the Diablo Region having only joined last April and it was fantastic! We went to sign up and the tour was full, Lillie was great, she said that the hotel was remodeling 2 additional rooms and if one was available she'd make room for us. The hotel had a room and Lillie welcomed us along on the tour.

We met the majority of the tour group at 6 AM Saturday morning at the Buttercup for breakfast, signing release forms and a drivers' meeting. The diverse group of 21 Porsches ranging from a 914-6 to a GT3 formed up in 2 groups and rolled out of the parking lot right on schedule, making our way across the Martinez bridge en-route to Cloverdale where we met two other Porsches joining the tour and to gas up. The tour made its way north on Highway 101 turning on to Highway 1 and on to the Chandelier Drive Thru Tree, an amazing redwood giant with the center cut out a long time ago, offering a great photo opportunity. It was time for us to get back in our cars and continue the tour. This proved to be quite a challenge for Lillie, who referred to it as "herding cats", a term she used more than once during the tour.

We then headed back out to Highway 101 heading north towards Garberville where we stopped for fuel and to stretch our legs before merging on to State route 254 "Avenue of the Giants". The weather was great, partly sunny, not too hot and not too cool, perfect for the air-cooled Porsches. We were now winding our way through the redwoods. If Carmen Miranda had been our tour guide you might mistake us for a conga line. The group stopped in Phillipsville for our lunch at the El Rio restaurant located in the Riverwood Inn, last of the Avenue of the Giants roadhouses and a mecca for Blues and Rock-a-Billy music at night. Lillie had reserved a large dining room for us where we enjoyed burritos, enchiladas, taco salads and refreshments. It was another great opportunity to get acquainted with other club members. As we drove through these glorious redwood giants reaching to the clouds, saved from the saw, you couldn't help but feel you were in an enchanted forest, lush with ferns, sorrel and moss covering the forest floor and the narrow road a ribbon of asphalt snaking around these giants. After driving about 20 minutes we arrived at the Humboldt Redwoods Visitors Center in Weott where we stopped to explore the great nature museum and its exhibits. The docents were very friendly and knowledgeable. One exhibit that caught our attention was the Travel Log built by Charles Kellogg in 1917. A vehicle made from a Nash Quad four wheel drive chassis and a body cut from the trunk of a fallen redwood that appeared to have been designed by Fred Flintstone. Was this the Cayenne's long lost ancestor?

Lillie again herded her cats and we were soon on our way to the Founders Grove Trail for a leisurely ½ mile hike to the huge Founder's Tree redwood. We arrived at the trailhead, changed shoes and set off. As we made our way to the Founder's Tree we passed fallen giants seizing the opportunity to take lots of pictures along the way. It was nice to again stretch our legs and breathe in the cool air scented with redwoods. We returned to the parking lot and changed back to our "driving" shoes and headed north towards the Scotia Inn in Scotia. We were doing great on time, running a little ahead of schedule so we made a stop at the Redcrest Gift Shop to browse the local gifts and crafts.

We arrived at the Scotia Inn so named in the 1940's. The original hotel was built in 1888 and burned down in the early 1900's. In 1923 the Mowatac Hotel named for the local Modoc Indians was built in its place. Lillie again herded her cats in the lobby of the hotel as we waited our turn to check in and as cats do, we quickly scattered to our separate rooms upon receiving our keys, to settle in and relax. Many of the rooms were furnished with period antiques and the hotel was beautifully trimmed in fine woodwork. A number of us met in the pub before dinner and enjoyed some "refreshments", others went for walks in town photographing the old homes and buildings, many having been restored. Dinner was again an opportunity to get acquainted and enjoy some great food. After a good night's sleep we met for the continental breakfast and Sunday driver's meeting. The hot topic of discussion during breakfast was the haunted third floor. Rooms are only available on the first and second floor.

During the night it had rained and the roads were damp as we departed the Scotia Inn at 9 am. We made our way back along the highway and winding side roads toward the Rockefeller Redwood Forest near the bustling metropolis of Honeydew, population 1000, it even has a Post Office! The sun was out and the road had dried. The last few miles into the Rockefeller Redwood Loop is a single lane with some potholes. John D. Rockefeller contributed \$2 million in matching funds back in 1918 to help California purchase this the finest stand of old growth redwoods in the world. During our stop we dispersed as cats often do, to hike along Bull Creek while others hiked the short trail to Tall Tree.


We returned to the parking lot and soon headed back out to the Avenue of the Giants, driving south, merging on to 101 heading to Benbow and lunch at the Benbow Inn. Lillie had out done herself again reserving the large dining room for our lunch stop. When we arrived the day had warmed up and the sun was out. We enjoyed French Dip sandwiches with a "Philly Cheese Steak" flair and great Caesar salads. As we departed the Benbow Inn, a few had made arrangements to stay longer, some returned to the Bay area and approximately 10 of us headed south to catch Highway 1 at Leggett bidding our farewells to our new acquaintances.

We merged on to Highway 1 and made our way to the coast and Fort Bragg. I think Josh said it best "my favorite part was the 60 mile flat out sprint that Kelly led!" I'd have to agree, but then again it was all great! We thoroughly enjoyed our first tour, kudos to Lillie for organizing a wonderful weekend. I have only one question, how did Josh and Lee Ann score the Bridal Suite at the Scotia Inn?
