




Now summer's here the track is the place to be...looking forward to the rest of a great driving year!

Shenandoah Valley Tour by Susan George

Saturday, April 27, we met up with the Diablo Porsche tour enthusiasts at Buttercup Pantry for Lillie Echevarria's tour. Promptly leaving at 8:30 a.m. from Walnut Creek and more tour members joined us in Jackson--all 33 people, and 18 cars. After crossing the Carquinez Bridge, we drove along the river where cabin cruisers could be seen. The sun was shining and it was a mild 60 degrees, but the temperature steadily crept up so that when we reached our first stop, the temperature was a toasty 71 degrees. We talked about our cars, ap-



plied sunscreen, bought some munchies.

Most cars with convertibles had their tops down, and we progressed onward. As we passed through Lodi we saw white picket fences and fruit trees. We eventually came through the little town of Clements and saw the Chocolate Factory on our left and grapevine covered hillsides. Later, the countryside turned to Oak savanna rolling hills; and, cattle were seen grazing. At Pioneer, we were at 3,000 feet where we encountered pines and oak woodlands. The road twisted and turned and became narrower for 65 miles. We reached Volcano and settled at the Volcano Union Inn for lunch. The décor was rustic, with long wooden tables, drinks were iced tea and lemonade; entrées included pulled pork sandwiches, pasta Bolognese, and chicken salad.





After lunch, we drove Old Highway 49 and arrived in Sutter Creek, an authentic gold rush town. The Inn was built before the Civil War, and has been open and serving guests for 40 years. Some of us stayed at the Sutter Creek Inn, which was surrounded by lovely gardens of Azaleas, Foxglove and statues, one of a little cherub pouring water and another of a woman half nude surrounded by flowers and pines There were brick pathways along the different rooms, a few named here Storage Room, which contained a swinging queen bed, Cellar Room, Stephen's Room, West Room, East Room, and the Garden Cottage where we stayed had a large queen sized bed and claw tub. Others stayed at the Days Inn. We had time to walk downtown to shop before wine tasting at Bella Grace next door to the Sutter Creek Inn.

We tasted olives oils flavored with rosemary, basil, garlic, lemon, jalapeno, and two virgin olive oils combined. We did wine tasting of whites. starting with а sparkling wine and continuing with reds. We then left there to prepare for dinner at J&D's Steakhouse. Dinner was delicious and varied: steak, salad. Mahi. mashed potatoes. Mahi beef brochettes. and а sampling of chicken, shrimp and steak, all served with vegetables and soup or salad.

Sunday started with coffee, and tea before breakfast at the Sutter Creek Inn. We waited to be seated, listening for the bell to ring at 9:00 a.m. The menu included corn bread, two jams strawberry and grape, with sausage links, baked chili eggs, and fresh fruit with whipped cream. Breakfast was served at three long tables, with brightly colored tablecloths, ironstone dishes and cute cow creamers. After breakfast, we drove to the Days Inn to line up for the second part of our tour to the Retirecide Alpacas Farm.

The alpacas had j u s t b e e n sheared. We were allowed into a pen containing baby alpacas. One was quite friendly and approached us for petting. They were so adorable



with their cropped bodies and straw like, puffy hairstyles. We saw dark brown, white, and grey alpacas, grey being the dominant color as the owner said she preferred grey.

Paige, the alpaca owner, uses the sheared fur to make hats,

gloves, socks, sweaters, shawls, and ponchos. These items were for sale.



We left for Cooper Vineyards around 11:20 a.m. Our long caravan of cars swerved and careened on the road to the gravel entrance. Pictures were the many colored, different model Porsches. At Cooper Vineyards we were seated on the outside of the open tasting room facing the vineyards.




We were treated to cheese, crackers, salami, carrots and pretzels. We tasted a variety of wines from Rose, to Pinot Grigio, Sauvignon Blanc, reds Sangiovese, Mouvedre, Barbera, Primitivo Tesoro, and Primitivo. We left to drive to Renwood Winery, where seating was available at long walnut colored tables with placemats. The seating area was a covered area with cushioned chairs.

We tasted a 2009 Tempranillo which was divine, and a Syrah 2010. Renwood Winery is famous for their Zinfandels. We were treated to "Premier Old Vine, 2010, Flutist 2010 and Musician's 2010". Some of the food items served were: Thai salad, roast beef sandwich, and chicken curry sandwiches. Renwood had a variety gift shop with a selection of cheeses and meats. Afterwards, we split into groups and drove home. Thank you Lillie, Tour Director Extraordinaire for an adventuresome weekend!




