




Narrow Roads and Porsche Heaven By Joe Mariscal

Day 1: Friday, July 12

Lillie's description of the Mammoth Tour included a descriptive term that I had previously heard in reference to thrill rides, as in roller coasters, climbing, descending, corkscrews, all at insane, gut-wrenching speed--whoopde-doo's. None of the thirteen drivers who assembled in Livermore had been on the Mammoth Tour, Lillie had opted out as Leader, so no one I spoke with really knew how this term really applied to the upcoming drive. I found out 24 hours later. But I am getting ahead of my story.

Ed Won, because he missed the turn into the meeting point and because he lost the coin toss to Terry Eaton, drove sweep for 17 Diablo Region Porsches, as we headed out H 120 toward Yosemite and Mammoth. Terry informed us in the drivers' meeting that we



would use Priest Grade rather than H120 for about 5 miles outside of Groveland. I gulped. What? Are you kidding me? Steep, narrow, twisty...but what the heck. I was the #2 car as we really did drive UP Priest Grade...slowly. At the top of the grade, at the re-entrance to H 120, was a YIELD SIGN due to oncoming traffic. Terry tapped his brakes, nearly stopping, then accelerated. I, in 2nd gear because the grade had lessened to 15%, reacted to his brake lights too late to shift into 1st, so I nearly stalled as I crested onto H 120. I am unaware of any others behind me doing the same...but I am sure none would admit stalling!

The Fresno bunch (Sequoia Region), 13 cars strong, were waiting for us at Crane Flat, the junction with Tioga Pass Road. I met Paul the Corvette guy, good-naturedly taking ribbing from

everyone for not driving a Porsche. In fact, I think he is a PCA member (!?) because "everybody in the Fresno group likes me." Really, he and his blue C6 fit in nicely. So now our group, bloated to 30 cars (including a Nissan SUV and a Yaris?), trundled off to Tenaya Lake for lunch.

Yosemite is at its showiest at Tenaya: huge granite peaks, sparkly alpine water, just enough breeze to keep it comfortable, and lunch under the sugar pines. All those P-cars in the parking lot created a commotion for several gawking tourists, including 4 dirty, happy, teenage trail workers. One of them, here from Houston for the summer, said, "We aren't leaving until we hear y'all start your cars and leave as a group!" Isn't that one of the prime reason for owning a Porsche? Oh yeah!

I have crossed Tioga Pass many times over the years, in cars and on foot...but never in a line of 30 beautiful Porsches...what a sight...a moving line of rumbling, whining, purring beauty rolling over a 10,000' mountain pass, then down the narrow, twisting descent to H395 at 7,000'. Truly impressive and exhilarating.

Day one came to an end with a meet and greet behind our hotel, hosted by Dave and Mark of Fresno.

Day 2: Saturday, July 13

One word description of this day: EPIC. Yes, we drove fast. We drove long. We

drove curves. We drove whoop-de-do's, We drove FAST. We drove narrow and slow. Some drove FASTER. And finally, we showed off our Porsches on the Plaza.

Find it, drive it, then try to wipe off your smile. Can't do it. Here's the deal: this road is isolated, well-paved, long (50 miles?), sweeping curves, humpy (whoop-de-do's). Fresno Dave decided to break us into two groups, spirited and everyone else. We left Mammoth in opposite directions,

planning to meet up at Lee Vining. I joined the "slower" group. The group accelerated as we entered Benton Crossing, carefully passing triathletes on their running portion of the triathlon in June Lake. Here come the humps! At speed, these come at you



FAST. The blue sky is all you see as you crest the hump, then a fast, steep descent. Many caught air, or at least butt lift. I glided over, no gas, stomach twirling...a thrill reminiscent of Disneyland. The second one will be easier, I was thinking. Not. But I held my speed. I glanced over at my co -pilot wife. She was blanched white, terror in her eyes, muttering "Pleasssse slow down!" So I did. Now the road straightens, as if the planner used a ruler, straight all the way to the horizon, mild humps to break the monotony.


We approached H 395, Mono Lake to our right, preparing to turn right toward Lee Vining. Honestly, this is the best Porsche road ever. Drive it. You will love it. Interesting oddity: the map of this loop looks like an antelope in repose.

Sublime to ridiculous: fuel and rest at Lee Vining, then an easy, slow, twisty, narrow tour of the Mammoth Scenic Loop to decompress, then home for lunch. 110 miles of Porsche driving heaven in the bank. Truly memorable. After lunch, we toured the Mammoth lakes Basin (three picZone Seven presents the Porsche of Livermore Concours

turesque alpine lakes).

But wait. Another unique memory to enjoy forever. The Village at Mammoth, a beautiful shopping center, invited us to park and show our cars, or at least twenty-eight of us. We spit and polished our machines, then parked them on the plaza,



mixed in with the festive folks walking and enjoying the live Cajun music, wonderful restaurants, good coffee shops. Ed Won's GT3 and my own 4S were parked at the primo best location, at the entrance to the Plaza. I was parked on grass! So much fun watching people admire our cars.



The High Sierra provides an incomparable star show. The brilliantly clear air, high altitude and cool nightly temperatures make stargazing a must in Mammoth. Thanks to the Fresno planners, and to Lilli, for memorable driving а experience and car show!

Day 3: Sunday, July 14

Fragmented group all departed Mammoth by 2pm. Most took the tram to the top of the adjacent peak for a panoramic view. Three cars, including mine, left town at 11am, heading for lunch at the Bridgeport Hotel. A few others came in as we were leaving. The balance came in much later.

Sonora Pass: in every way, more challenging than Priest Grade-steep (26%) up and steep down, twisty (1st gear hairpins), high altitude (9500'), narrow (1 $\frac{1}{2}$ lanes). The temperature began climbing soon after cresting the Pass, to 95F at our health break at Strawberry, cool and refreshing on the back patio of Strawberry Inn. A few miles West, at Jamestown, temp now 98F, our small group of three decided to head for home separately because of three different home locations. Temp was now 98-100F across the entire valley in heavy, slow traffic. 50 mph all the way to Manteca. Home! Alameda was a cool, comfortable 68F.

I cannot overstate praise for the organizing skills of Lilli, carried forward by Ed Won and Terry Eaton. Bravo! A fabulous weekend in Porsche paradise.





What Makes a Great Driver?

What makes a great driver? And don't say, "Greatness!"

Before I begin to give you my answer I want dispel the myth that great drivers are born great, that they popped out of the womb with natural driving talent. If you consider the hundreds of millions of years that mankind has evolved, and think about the fact that the automobile has only been around for a little over a hundred years, it's kinda hard to imagine that our DNA has adapted much to the art and science of driving, let alone performance driving. We may have developed the ability to run from sabertoothed tigers (and the more modern-day versions of that type of danger), but I find it hard to believe that our minds and bodies have evolved in a way to keep up with our cars.

If we had, we would have three feet so we didn't have to use one foot to do two things during heel and toe downshifting! In fact, we've adapted our cars faster than we've adapted our bodies, building cars with semi-automatic (with automatic throttle blip-

pers) to make up for our shortcomings with downshifting.

Another point of proof of how we haven't evolved to drive cars is what we do with our vision. I've read that humans are designed to process information visually at no more than 12 MPH. See? When was the last time you traveled at just 12 MPH on a racetrack?

I would suggest that one of the things that make a great driver, especially what I'll refer to as a performance driver (anyone who appreciates the art and science of driving, and especially participates in sport driving activities such as autocross, track day events, HPDE, and racing), is how they use their vision.

I won't go into great detail since I plan to write more about these in future articles, but the keys to performance driving vision are:

- Looking far enough ahead.
- Looking where you want to go, and not where you don't want to go.
- Having the ability to process visual information that is coming at you at far more than 12 MPH.
- Having the ability to mentally see what you want to see, when you want to see it (even if you can't physically see it).

Again, I'll come back to these points in future articles, but for now I'm simply planting a seed to allow you time to think about them.

Perhaps the most important attribute of a great driver has little to do with a physical ability, and more with a mindset or attitude.

In my experience, what separates the great from the not-so-great drivers is their attitude towards their development as drivers.

After thirty-something years of racing, instructing, coaching, writing about and talking about performance driving, the attitudes of drivers still amazes me. To sum these attitudes up in the most succinct way... the best drivers know they have so much more to learn, and the worst drivers seem to think they know it all.

I love it when I meet someone who has a strong belief in themselves. This confidence is a strong predictor of how successful they will be. The Henry Ford saying, "If you think you can or think you can't, you're probably right" comes to mind. Without a strong inner belief in oneself, it's unlikely you'll ever be as good as you could be.

But there's a fine line between having a strong belief and having an ego that's getting in the way of learning and being as good as you can be.

Great drivers have an open mind to learning. More than that, they have a burning desire to get better; they love to improve their performance. If I had to pick just one thing that separates the great from the not-so-great, it would be this open mind to both learning and constant improvement.

With that said, I'm hoping that you'll keep an open mind to what I write here in future articles. Here's to being a great driver!

Muscle Milk Tour By Joe Mariscal

Ted and Ingrid French hosted this day's tour of the Muscle Milk Motorsports home base facility in Benicia. 30+ cars met in the parking lot of The Buttercup Pantry in Walnut Creek. I am still a "new guy" to the Diablo Region crowd, so I must apologize for not recognizing most of some familiar faces, but I do remember two of the many Porsches in the lot: those two very fine pristine Porsches 993 4S, my personal favorites. The check-in duties and rollout couldn't finish quickly enough to beat the heat, as my thermometer was registering 89F as we turned right out of the parking lot at 930AM.

Sorry, but I did hear our host's name at Muscle Milk, but he really put on a wonderful show. A brief outline of what Muscle Milk Motorsports is all about:

Muscle Milk Motorsports (known as Muscle Milk Pickett Racing in ALMS) is a motorsports group from Benicia, California. The team was founded in 2007 by <u>CytoSport</u> co-founder and former <u>IMSA</u> <u>GT Championship</u> driver Greg Pickett.



Since 2007, Pickett's team has competed in the <u>American Le</u> <u>Mans Series</u>, the <u>24 Hours of Le Mans</u> and the <u>IMSA GT3 Cup</u> <u>Challenge</u> (Thank you, Wikipedia).

Our main points of interest were the Porsche RS Spyders, raced by Muscle Milk in 2009-2010. We saw one complete version and parts of 2 others. These race machines are museum quality examples of LMP2-class race cars: Powerful, beautiful, hi-tech, examples of winning cars that are still current in their technology and performance.



Muscle Milk changed to Aston Martins, Hondas, following 2010 (We did not see these...they may have been behind the "do not enter" barrier.). The one complete Spyder is magnificent: it was truly breathtaking to closely examine this car up close, from the non-turbo Porsche V-8 powerplant to the modular dash, steering wheel, and suspension components. It seems like the entire car could be disassembled by removing about 20 bolts!



Additionally, one of the Pickett grandsons offered information about the 4 racing Karts, as hi-tech as the Spyder. And more tasty motoring treats were on display across the room: a 1968 Camaro Z28, <u>the real deal</u>; and a 1963 Corvette Stingray <u>split-window</u> <u>coupe</u>...double wow! Nice to see that

Mr. Pickett is also a Chevy fan. Oh yes, a V-12 MBZ twin-turbo monster, too.



Two hours evaporated in a wink, but we grabbed sample packets of Muscle Milk products, drank their appreciated soft drinks, and headed to downtown Benicia and the *First Street Cafe* for lunch. 30+ Diablo folks shared a fine lunch of gourmet sandwiches, salads, and dessert. I first heard of this cafe while cycling through town but never stopped. This cafe is worth the trip to Benicia...good food and excellent service. Dede and I wandered through this picturesque town a bit, down to Suisun Bay. Benicia has a good vibe: a good mixture of old architecture and modern culture. Again, worth a visit (I promise that I am not on the Benicia Chamber of Commerce!).
