the ideal word for the Saturday, March 22 tour to Yosemite. From the peaceful, quiet deer in the meadow



to the unbelievably majestic geological monoliths, it all was such a soothing respite from the violence, death and destruction that is all too typical of both the domestic and international scene in the media each day.

Let's face it; driving a well handling Porsche on Highways 140 or 120 is an additional, but very substantial part of the joy of an event up in California's mountains.



All seven of my previous Porsches were coupes, and I staunchly held no interest whatever in going topless. Saturday, as we closed in on the National Park, I became increasingly aware of how much more I was seeing after putting the Boxster's top down. It was awesome!

I now find myself a bit depressed of having been deprived by my coupe top of

the inspiration that has always been Yosemite. Not having a top provided another advantage: every photo in these two columns was taken while



I was seated in the Boxster.

Getting back to the pleasure of driving a Porsche, it was real and substantial and especially so on roads that curve enough to give some test to the suspension. I once had the experience



of driving a rental many hours on Highways 120 and 49 and that was nearly painful by contrast. I expect that my autocross compulsion to straighten every curve and clip

each apex very tightly was at least a distraction to the Porsche behind me; it clearly was also some sort of problem to a 911 in front of me when that car got into at least one corner too hot trying to stay out of my way.

"Too hot" was also a problem for both group leaders in the upper foothills. Each was stopped by a CHP officer, but Brian's quick admission to 72 mph avoided a ticket.

My First Porsche

In response to Ron Leppke's invitation, I've searched high and low for a picture of my first Porsche but, alas, they've all been tossed. Nevertheless, you shouldn't have any problem conjuring up the image: it was a beige '67 912.

I purchased it new from a Porsche dealership in Washington, D.C., where I was working at the time. I was so innocent of sports cars in general and Porsches in particular that when I picked up the car, I asked the salesman why it didn't have whitewall tires. He gave me a contemptuous stare and sent me on my way with the new car.

The 912 had a 4-speed transmission, Solex carburetors, skinny 4 1/2 inch tires, and an AM-FM radio. It was hot in the summer, cold in the winter, and from the day it was new it burned a quart of oil every 600 miles.

The day after I got the car, I called the membership chairwoman of the PCA Potomac Region, and she told me the Porsche Parade was being held in the Washington area that very week. I attended and as a result I got incurably infected with all things Porsche. In those days, the Parades had a drawing for a new Porsche, which that year was won by a guy who already had three Porsches.

That initial experience led to my wife and me and our kids going to Parades in the following years at great places like Fort Lauderdale, Boston, the Playboy Club in Wisconsin, Sun Valley, and Monterey.

Of course, when I got the '67 912 I knew little about serious driving. I thought

heeling-and-toeing was a dance. But I went to drivers schools, autocrossed. and learned quickly. I'll never forget my first drivers school. When the instructor took us down the first straight and out of the first turn at Summit Point, I said to myself, "This guy is going to wreck my car and kill us both." But a half hour later, I was going deep into those turns, roaring out, and having the time of my life. Later, I was able to hone my skills at the Jim Russell Racing Drivers School at Willow Springs, where we drove Formula C cars. What a thrill they are. You sit so low you can reach out and touch the ground.

After I had the '67 912 for two years, I moved up to a '69 911 T with the Webers, the odd-shift-pattern 5-speed transmission, and a lot more horse-power. That was a big improvement, but those early Porsches were, and remain, primitive vehicles compared to even the econo cars of today. They're not in the same automotive universe with my 996. Nevertheless, for their time, they were a great introduction to Porsches, Porsche people, and the exhilarating world of high performance driving.
