A Note From Charles Rooks

I want to thank all my Diablo Region members and friends who have sent words of encouragement due to my recent BMW accident while stopped on the freeway and being rear ended by a distracted driver. Several of the notes were from members I haven't yet met but will do so in the future. I am on a slow 3 month recovery and will have surgery next week. I am looking forward to when I can drive my Boxster through the twisties again, with the top down and enjoying our beautiful scenery.

My injuries would be a lot less severe if the shoulder strap in my 2011 BMW 328i would have locked up as it was supposed to do so in an abrupt motion. My Boxster's shoulder strap locks up whenever I reach quickly to change a radio station but I don't recall that my BMW's shoulder strap ever locking up anytime I owned the car. Next time you sit in your daily driver or Porsche, give the shoulder strap a firm tug and see if locks. It not, get it fixed / replaced or confirmed that it is working correctly
