
Now, we get to the Porsche owners...



The Quest for Bronze II (1994) by Eugenie Thomas

According to Webster, **rally** - "a competitive automobile run over public roads and under ordinary traffic rules with the object of maintaining a specified average speed between checkpoints over a route unknown to the participants until the start of the run." - Sounds easy! **Navigation** -"the method of determining position, course and distance traveled." - Sounds fairly easy!

This particular rally ran on some of the best Porsche roads available. There were plenty of delightful open roads to enjoy (or in my case, to make up for "lost" time). As the Rally progressed, the roads became narrower and more winding (which, in my opinion, is what Porsches do best).

Last year, Mother Nature provided warmth and flowers; this year, she provided dark skies and plenty of pain (I mean RAIN). The roads became a challenge to see and to grip, and at times the downpour hampered the sightings of the checkpoints (my navigator's excuse for missing two). But, in spite of the dreary weather, the scenery was spectacular - Al (Al Armellini, Ed.) did a great job choosing the route.

The activity that sets this Rally apart from others is that the checkpoints are historical (bronze markers) and the words must be partially written down in a "fill-in-the-blanks" format as proof of arrival at the checkpoint. This provided an opportunity to learn something new (or long forgotten)!

It was drizzling during our picnic lunch stop, so the park was vacant, leaving the only tree-shaded table just for the participants of our Rally. From this point forward, the roads became "real country," the rain became heavy, and my patience level pushed (soon thereafter, my navigator was earning his first-ofmany "bops on the head").

A recurring surprise was a car ahead of us that "chronologically" should have been behind us. (Dread seeps in!) However, when you haven't seen another participant for over thirty minutes, it's definitely time to re-evaluate (another earned "bop on the head"). Refer to Webster's definition concerning "maintaining a specific average speed" - somebody goofed.

This is where the real challenge emerges - keeping my mouth SHUT and my hands on the wheel instead of the closest neck.

Needless to say, my favorite part of the trip was the "end" where we gathered inside for warmth, dryness and thirst quenching. The Rally was an optional overnight, and from those that stayed, it sounded like a good time was had by all.

Tours are for fun - rallys are competitive. If you've never done a Rally (and seriously want to WIN), here are suggestions: (1) if you change tire size, realize that the odometer is no longer accurate, (2) the navigator should be a math whiz, (3) if it rains, don't take an older Porsche. In choosing the navigator, he/she should be able to take abuse, never say "WE" made a mistake, and preferably not share your address. My son navigated in the past two rallys and we lost miserably. But I'm still the Mom and always right. Yes, my next navigator will be someone with whom I won't have to spend the holidays.

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The Maritime Blue RS (a work in progress) by Warren Gardner Jr.

Like the Italians say, it was a thunderbolt of love, a "colpo di fulmine". The instant I saw her I just had to have her. It's spring in France in 1992, and my buddy Bruno and I were out at the old Circuit Monthlery, dodging Pit Road race traffic as we dashed toward the old highbanked section. She stopped us both dead in our tracks. Calmly sitting there, unoccupied, coolly tucked in next to the fence at Pit Out. She wore blue, a stunning shade called maritime blue to be precise, with special silver trim on her sides for contrast. Unmistakable to the cognoscenti, yet her flanks were splashed with "Carrera RS" to dispel any doubt. What a world-class hussy! Well, we knew she was a gem, and we weren't the only ones. Oh no, every darn guy that walked by, or happened to get sight of her, all had to come pay homage to this new beauty: the first RS child from Porsche in 19 years.

Bruno and I both took photos of her that day, but the damage had been done. Her image remained burned indelibly in our souls. For me, she was absolutely the first Carrera RS of the 1992 model I had ever seen in the metal, and she looked ravishing in her special blue; the same racing color that Porsche had recently started using for their Cup Series race cars. Maritime blue, while evocative of French blue, or the famous Bugatti blue, was undeniably mixed to yield a strong hint of lavender shading. Not inappropriately, lavendar is the famous herb that runs rampant on hillsides in the south of France; just as the RS was destined to do as well. The color was alluring, to be sure, but her hunkered down stance, her leather color coordinated racing seat shells, her enormous drilled brakes, all were seductive for their performance potential. But my dreams of her were likely to remain a love unrequited. Her father, Porsche AG, was not going to allow this beautiful child to come to the USA. The rest of the world yes, but America, oh this wasn't going to happen, sorry about that, old chap.

Months later, as I'm on the line with Chick Stanton, Porsche salesman extraordinaire in Washington D.C., I'm ecstatic to learn that something very special is being cooked up by Porsche Cars North America (PCNA), a limited edition performance model to be called the RS America.

But wait, there's more! The car will be available for Tourist Delivery, as Chick had just placed an order for one with a customer in Chicago. Before I put the phone down with Chick, I'd made up my mind. This was my dream car, and I was going to buy it! I managed to get the requisite info from Chick on how to send him a deposit, but my head was swimming! This was my second Porsche to special order, but it's heady business having a Porsche built to your desire! And Chick promised to ask PCNA whether I could get it painted maritime blue too (even though the Euro cars came this color, it was not a listed color choice for USA)! No more than a few days later, as Chick called me back with dream shattering news, I got reminded of how our "small world" Porsche culture is complex, multifaceted, but refreshingly oriented toward the owner's special wishes. Still, there are limits. So, it was a version of "boy meets girl, boy loses girl", and I couldn't have my blue dream car; but what color seat belts did I want in my white RS America?




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GGR Porboys Beginner Autocross School

It is that time of year to start thinking about all of the great Porsche driving opportunities in 2006. On Saturday, March 4, 2006, Howard Yao and John Seidell will again run this school. It is really for beginners or people who have autocrossed only a few times. If you have ever wondered what it is like to experience driving your Porsche on the edge (but safely in control) then this is for you. This is a good safe place for drivers to learn about the handling of their Porsche.

The school will be on the large parking lot of Candlestick Park (Monster Park) in South San Francisco. The day begins at 7:30 AM with registration, teching of cars, and then a driver's meeting at 8:15. Students will then walk the course with their morning instructors. After that, students will be driving on skidpads in order to learn the feel of an oversteering and an understeering car. It is a lot of fun!! The day will proceed with students running the Autocross course with their instructors while half of the students learn to work the course. As in the past, Mr. Larry Sharp, who is a famous course designer and our Zone 7 Rep., will make up the course for this year's event.

After the lunch break we continue to run cars in hour sessions until 5 PM. It is truly a fun day with lots of learning. One of the best parts is that students get a few rides in their instructor's car. We try as best we can to have instructors that have had experience with cars similar to the students. You will also have different instructors in the morning and afternoon.

The school is sponsored Joe and Annie Zeiph, the owners of Porboys German Automotive Service. They are located at 3640 East 9th ST. in Oakland. Joe and his technicians are experts in the repair of all German makes, but they specialize in the maintenance and repair, including complete rebuilds of 911, 944, 914, 928, and Boxster cars. 
If you sign up and pay the \$95 fee, you get:

2006 Porsche Parade – Portland, Oregon (Aug 6-11)

Latest news on Registration Opening day for registration will be Friday, March 10, 8Am EST, 2006. As always, our rules aim to give everyone an even chance of being accepted by prohibiting early registration. Online registration will be enabled at 8:00 a.m. Eastern time, at the PCA Registration Site. Mailed registration forms must be postmarked March 10, 2006 or later to be considered for acceptance any forms postmarked earlier will be rejected. But there is no reason to get into a frantic rush. All online registrations made at any time on March 10, and all paper registrations postmarked on March 10, will be deemed to have been submitted at the same exact time, so take your time and register leisurely at any convenient time on March 10. In case of over subscription, the formula in the Region Procedures Manual (available at PCA.org) will be used to determine the acceptance of entries.




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That's My Job by Larry Sharp (PCA National Zone 7 Representative)

Well this is the start or my second year as your Zone Rep. Now you may be wondering what is a Zone Rep and what do I do? The first part is easy. A zone Rep is a person that the National Board of Directors of PCA appoints to be the link between the National Office and the Local Regions.

The Person that is to be considered for the Zone Rep Position has normally been a Region President during his or her membership. I am the person that the Region Presidents use as a sounding board for Ideas, and I am a resource for information that is useful for The Region Presidents and the general membership.

To become A Zone Rep you must volunteer for it to the National Board by filling out a form that is on the national website. Sometimes people seek out the job and volunteer for it and others get asked to do it by a Region president or an outgoing Zone Rep. The National Board of Directors of PCA then ask for the advice from the Region Presidents about the potential Candidates. The PCA Board of Directors then appoints the person they see as the best fit to the Zone and to the Nation Board.

The Term is for Two years with no limits to how long you can serve as a Zone Rep. So Every Two years if I am still wishing to be a Zone Rep I must fill out the forms like anyone else and go through the process of being appointed.

That's the part on how to become a Zone Rep. Now the fun part is once you become the Zone Rep you found out that it is the best Job in PCA. I am supposed to go out to the Regions and attend as many events as possible to make sure that PCA is serving the memberships as best they can. So darn, I must attend Crab or go to Laguna Seca to attend the Porscheplatz. I also try to attend Region Board meetings when I can so I can be of help to the Volunteers that are running your Regions.

My National duties is to attend the two National Board meetings a year as your Regions President proxy just in case some items need to be voted on at the board meeting. The Zone Reps also meet twice a year and Develop new ideas and events that meet the needs of the membership.

One such Idea was our own local "Escape to the Wine Country" event last year in Redwood Region. This Idea was started among the National Zone Reps and the local Region made it happen.

So that's a Brief description of what my position is and what I am supposed to do. I will be out there attending events so if you want to say hi or ask me a Question feel free to do so... That's my job.

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Porsche Driving Tips by Ted Fisher



Drivers Education Event a Zone 7 Event - hosted by the Diablo Region



Summary: This Driver's Education (DE) event will be a non-competitive single day outing at Thunderhill racetrack, run under PCA National Drivers Education Guidelines expressly for PCA members. The objective of the event is to provide the opportunity for Porsche Club members, especially those having little or no track experience, to safely learn the techniques of driving a high speed road course while operating under expert supervision and instruction. Alternatively, the event will offer Club members with prior track experience the opportunity to refine or remediate their driving skills at technically challenging Thunderhill. Porsche cars are therefore the expected vehicles of choice for members and Event Instructors.

This event has been moderately priced, primarily as an inducement to first timers. The Admission Fee per driver will be \$170 for those who register and pay before February 25. After that, the registration fee will increase to \$185. Lunch is included in the fee for the day's event. The Admission Fee for Event Instructors will be \$90, with lunch included. Registration for drivers will be taken on a first come, first served basis. There are limitations on the number of drivers that can be accepted, so early registration is recommended. The registration form follows.

Featuring: This DE event comprises traditional Novice, Intermediate, and Advanced Run Groups. **The Novice Run Groups:** Two Novice groups (Groups C1 and C2), with no more than 18 drivers per group, will alternate throughout the day. All Novice Drivers will be paired with an Event Instructor/s until such time as the Novice has demonstrated the skill sets necessary for solo track driving. There will be at least 20 Event Instructors available on site. We also anticipate that our instructor cadre will include female instructors, which should heighten interest for our Novice lady drivers. A mandatory ground school for Novices will occur in the morning prior to the day's event as will other training and guidance required for all groups per PCA Guidelines. Only street registered Porsches will be permitted to run in Novice groups.

The Intermediate Run Group (Group B) will not exceed 25 drivers, not counting Event Instructors. The Intermediate Run Group will not permit passengers unless they are Event Instructors. A limited number of Event Instructors may drive in Intermediate Group, or they may ride and coach at their discretion. Only street registered cars will be permitted on track in the Intermediate Run Group. The Event Chairperson may grant an exception to this rule on a case-by-case basis.

The Advanced Run Group will not exceed 20 drivers, not counting Event Instructors. The Advanced Run group will have Event Instructors, either driving solo, or alternatively Event Instructors may take student passengers, provided their car is adequately equipped for such.

Applications from interested and qualified Instructors are solicited now. Instructor applicants may submit their driving and/or instructor related resume or bio directly to the attention of the Event Chairperson or Chief Instructor. Event Instructors will enjoy a concessionary price for the day's event.

In accordance with PCA Guidelines, "the car owner must certify that their car is safe to run on the track and that the car has been inspected by a regionally approved person or shop within thirty days prior to the event. A regionally approved person need not be in the business of commercially preparing cars, but must have recognized skill in the preparation of cars that he/she inspects." With many thanks from our Technical Sponsors, we are making arrangements to offer a series of hosted Technical Events and special price technical inspection services throughout the Zone 7 Region in the month prior to this event. The full list of participants has not been finalized, but includes Michael Stead Porsche of Walnut Creek, Porsche of Fremont, etc. Greater information on the Technical Events and Tech Services will be forthcoming as soon as possible.
