





aul Schrenk of German Motorsports, who has chosen to close his business. It is probably until to take up unpaid ad space to recognize a former sponsor, but I would like to do just that.

I first began serious autocrossing with my '79 SC. The setup, including heavier torsion bars, adjustable antisway bars plus more, was done in a Modesto shop where Paul was an employee. About 15 championships later, all the SC goodies were transferred to an '84 Carrera with Paul, if I recall accurately, doing about 90% of that work. The Glacier Blue Carrera worked as well or better than the SC and the championships continued.

The next Carrera was an '86 and, based on the trust I had developed with his Modesto work, I sought out Paul's German Motorsports whenever I needed a good and reliable Porsche mechanic and shop. The work was good and the prices fair. Having had some serious problems with other Porsche mechanics along the way (none locally), it was very reassuring and settling to have

a resource like Paul available; it is equally unsettling to lose such a dependable and fair alternatve for good Porsche maintanence.
