

#### Second Annual DIABLO Mille PCA

The California Mille is an annual historic and classic car tour run on public roads. It is inspired by the Mille Mighta, a former Italian open-road endurance race covering some 1500 km (or roughly 1000 miles) from Brescia-to-Rome-to-Brescia and ran twenty-four times from 1927 to 1957. The Mille Mighta (Thousand Miles pronounced ['mille 'milkaa]) was an open-road endurance race which took place in Italy twenty-four times from 1927 to 1957 (thirteen before the war, eleven from 1947). Like the older Targa Florio and later the Carrera Panamericana, the MM made Gran Turismo (Grand Touring) sports cars like Alfa Romeo, Ferrari, Maserati and Porsche famous. In California this annual car tour replicates the Italian counterpart with a major meeting place in San Francisco, CA



### VW chairman heads for driving seat in Porsche deal

OLBIA, Italy, May 12 (Reuters) - Volkswagen's (VOWG.DE) chairman has laid down the terms for a merger with Porsche SE in a clear sign that Europe's biggest carmaker has won the upper hand in a power struggle with a would-be predator.

Although it owns more than half of VW, heavily indebted Porsche (PSHG\_p.DE) has seen its plan to buy its much bigger rival spoiled by the financial crisis.

Now that its gamble to take over VW has backfired, Porsche is fighting for influence in a union with the globe's No.3 car company and its stable of brands spanning Bugatti and Lamborghini to the Volkswagen Golf.

Talking to reporters at a car launch late on Monday, VW Chairman Ferdinand Piech named ally VW Chief Executive Martin Winterkorn as his candidate to head a merged group.

He said it was unlikely Porsche boss Wendelin Wiedeking would be happy to stay on in a more "lowly" role. Such criticism from Piech, who is also a major shareholder in Porsche, has ended the careers of other managers.

Piech also played down the chances for Porsche finance chief Holger Haerter to take a top job in the new group, saying his counterpart at VW, Hans Dieter Poetsch, was more credible.

Porsche declined to comment on Piech's statements.

Piech revealed it had already been decided that the headquarters of a new group -- which he said could be named after Auto Union, a carmaker Adolf Hitler used to showcase German engineering prowess -- would be in Volkswagen's home of Wolfsburg.

Piech warned that Porsche needed first

to get its 9 billion euro (\$12.3 billion) in debts under control before a deal could be agreed.

"I cannot imagine that VW would assume another company's risks," said Piech. He added that he was not in favour of selling a stake in the luxury carmaker to another investor.

Porsche's stock fell 10.4 percent on the comments, which one analyst said raised the gloomy prospect that the group would be forced to issue new shares to repay borrowings before embarking on a deal. Preference shares in VW VOWG\_p.DE rose as much as 4 percent.

#### WHIP HAND

Piech's remarks demonstrate how the tables have turned on Porsche after an audacious takeover bid hatched by Wiedeking and Haerter unravelled.

"In case anyone didn't understand, Piech is making clear today that he is the victor," said one analyst, who asked not to be named.

Piech signalled disagreement over the value of the Porsche sports car business, saying that an 11 billion euro price tag was 2 billion Euros too high.

Wiedeking had wanted to secure access to Volkswagen's technical know-how and the car parts that it uses, for example, from the VW off-road Touareg, to make its Cayenne.

He used share options to creep towards majority control in Volkswagen, making billions of Euros in paper gains as Volkswagen's stock price spiked. However, the move lumbered the Stuttgart-based group with heavy debts, which became difficult to handle when credit markets froze.

Wiedeking also had bet that the European Commission would overturn a German law that gives the regional government a veto on decisions at VW, which would include letting Porsche take management control.

But that has not happened and has put the more than 10 billion Euros in savings at VW that Porsche had hoped to use to repay its debts out of its reach. In addition, German financial markets watchdog BaFin said on Tuesday that it had started an investigation into possible market manipulation by Porsche linked to its attempt to take over VW. [ID:nWEA1742]


For Piech, the merger -- which both car companies say they want to hammer out within four weeks -- presents him with an opportunity to tighten his grip on both Volkswagen and Porsche.

He and his brother, who together own just over a quarter of Porsche, have been deadlocked in a dispute with their cousins and co-owners from the rival Porsche clan.


Swallowing the sports car maker into the Volkswagen empire would reduce Porsche's status to just one car brand among 10.





The 3rd Thursday Dinner is held the third Thursday of every month at 6:30 PM at Strizzis in Danville at 3456 Camino Tassajara.






