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## The Inside Line By Steve Jones

Well my friends, the saga continues. While the press re-

ported an agreement in principle for VW to acquire Porsche, as of this writing tax and corporate law issues have arisen that appear to be holding the deal up. It's not clear when we can expect this to be resolved, but you can read up on the history behind the two branches of the Porsche-Piech families and the maneuvering that's brought us to this point. Warren Gardner told me about a two-part series on Der Spiegel Online that goes into fascinating detail, and you can find a link to this article on the Diablo web site.

Things are on track for our annual Tour Da Jour to be held on Saturday, August 22<sup>nd</sup> - last year's event was great fun, and I can't wait to see what Jack and Phil have in store for us this year. Unfortunately the same cannot be said for the rally we had scheduled for the 8<sup>th</sup>. We had a couple volunteers who had offered to organize this event but each had to withdraw as a result of what we keep hearing newscasters and pundits refer to as "current economic conditions." Fortunately September is booked solid with an average of one event each week, so in some sense it will all balance out.

This has been a pretty rough year for the Zone rally program in general, and I'd like to regroup and start organizing now in support of the 2010 program. Ideally I'd like to establish a committee of three to five members who've run at least a few rallies and can put in an hour a week on average planning for an event to be held in the March-April time frame. By starting in September with a group we can create a top notch rally without any one person having to knock themselves out trying to do this single-handedly two weeks prior to the event. In keeping with Diablo's traditional character this was a relaxed and highly social event held at the home of Kathy and Luis Soler, and I want to thank them both again for providing such an excellent venue, and for all the hard work they did preparing for the event. Please review the next few pages to read my remarks made during the celebration and to view some photos taken by our own Ken Wu and Doug Wiebe.

As we get well into the second half of our 25th year, I hope you'll all give some thought the the upcoming elections for the board of directors. A nominating committee is being formed, and there will be four positions up for election this year. # Years

We lack an official region historian, and I'm a relatively recent arrival to Diablo and Zone 7, but by digging through the earliest, dustiest records we have in storage I was able to turn up the following information that I thought I'd share with you on the occasion of Diablo's 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary.

For example, the earliest official board meeting I could find documented was held February 2<sup>nd</sup>, 1984 at John Webb's home. There are two people who attended that meeting that immediately stood out for me. The first was Jim Pasha, who was a nationally recognized author and enthusiast – many of you will recognize his name from his work in the magazine Excellence, but Jim was part of Diablo right at the beginning. Unfortunately Jim died of a heart attack last year while doing what he loved – washing and waxing his Porsche.

The other name that stood out is John Clever. Sadly, John passed away some years ago and recent members may not even recognize his name. But as I've worked with our region's records over the past two years, John shows up again and again as a central figure. Almost every long-time member I've talked to has eventually shared a story about John, and while nobody is perfect John appears to have been universally respected for his expertise and enthusiasm.

When Diablo received it's charter from PCA National, we were the 118<sup>th</sup> region to have been formed. With over 120

members, we were as large or larger than half the regions then in existence. It would take until December of that year, but eventually Diablo became an official California corporation.

At this first board meeting, the very first official Diablo event was proposed. Given our tendencies, it shouldn't be surprising that this first event was a tour to the Stonyridge, Concannon, and Wente wineries. This is the clearest reflection of Diablo values I can think of – wine first, paperwork second. We hadn't even filed our bylaws with PCA National before we were trying to figure out how to get somebody to pour us a drink!

The board planned a Charter Dinner that was held on May 5<sup>th</sup>, 1984. Any member joining Diablo before that date was to be considered a charter member of the region, and was eligible to attend the dinner. While there was some concern about meeting the minimum number of attendees, the board never had any doubts that the bar minimum would be reached. 12 dozen wine glasses with the new region logo were ordered, and each person attending the Charter Dinner received one; leftovers would be sold through the goodie store.

The April 20<sup>th</sup>, 1984 board meeting wasn't adjourned until 10:55PM Pacific time. Personally, this gives me hope that I may not have presided over the latest board meeting in region history, though I concede I've come awfully darn close.

The September board meeting has a note that struck me as odd. Apparently the Miller Brewing Company had been using the PCA logo in their ads. The minutes are clear: it wasn't the Porsche logo, it was the PCA logo. A letter was sent asking them to stop using the PCA logo, but I didn't see any mention of what happened afterwards.

I was able to turn up some membership figures over the years. As mentioned, in 1984 we had something over 120 members. By 1988 that number had grown to 595 mmbers and their affiliates – including one Sharon Neidel, our current Zone 7 Representative. Now, in July 2009, we have 977 regular members and their family members or affiliates. The regular members represent about 0.97% of all dues-paying PCA members as of this writing.

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
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


## TOUR DA JOUR




## Advocate Alerts

Just a couple of items come to mind that you really need to check out in this issue.


- Phil Eskildsen has delivered us a new beautiful design for Diablo Region's name tags. The new order form is on page 20. Be sure to check it out and get yours soon.





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## Report from Porsche Parade 2009 – Keystone, Colorado By Phil Eskildsen

The annual Porsche Parade has become one of the ultimate gatherings of the Porsche faithful. This event typically hosts nearly 1000 cars and 2000 PCA members in a five day event which includes a number social, touring and competitive events. One interesting way to travel to Parade is to caravan with one or more fellow attendees. A number of caravan groups are usually available with varying itineraries, speeds and daily driving distances. Phil & Harriet Eskildsen and Jack & Jan Carpenter drove the 1200 miles to Keystone at a very leisurely pace, including three overnight stops along the way. Yes, it is possible to fit all this stuff in the back seating area of a 996 (without using the front trunk).



Parade begins with a Welcome Banquet, includes Concours, Autocross, TSD Rally, Tech Quiz, 5K Run, RC Cars Autocross, Tech Sessions, Scenic Tours, Goodie Store, Art Show and a number of events designed for children. Distinctive Parade trophies are awarded for all competitive events. Our own Jim Baccus trophied in Autocross. An all-expense paid trip for two the Germany is the grand prize awarded by a drawing at the closing banquet. Many other prizes are awarded at other banquets and events.

Unlike in previous years, the Porsche family members did not attend since they were busy in Germany attempting to find a way to extricate Porsche AG from it's current financial crisis caused by the attempt to take over Volkswagen.

Parade is not possible without the efforts of many volunteers. This is a good way to meet interesting members from other regions. 
