I want to thank all of these members for their service and support, as well as those added to the board in the 2008 election: Francisco Cabrita and Kay Maloy (Linda, Jim, and Phil were re-elected).

And looking forward to 2010, I would like to officially congratulate the members recently elected to the board, who will begin their two year terms starting in January: Rick Davenport, Walter Lietz, Doug Wiebe, and Ken Wu.

I would like to thank all the members that stepped forward and led tours, organized events, directed traffic, hosted parties, helped out setting up locations – and there are many. But listing all of them would take several pages, not even counting the people serving as chairs and other positions listed on page 2 of the Advocate every month. All these volunteers are the lifeblood of our club, and it is this collective energy and participation that delivers the rich calendar of events that we've enjoyed over the past two years. And it also means that if I try to make such a list I will miss a number of deserving people – which I don't want to end up doing.

As a compromise I will call out one couple that I feel has really made a difference in our region, and gone above and beyond. Kathy and Luis Soler have lead tours, hosted events in their home, and contributed their time on an on-going basis to the running of club programs. To me, they show the same kind of dedication and passion that Diablo has enjoyed from the Carpenters, the Durans, and the Schmidts over the years. I am grateful for their generosity, proud to call them friends, and eager to help them in the future.

Thank you all again for the opportunity to serve our club and community over the past two years. I will continue to attend board meetings and help out where I can, and will definitely offer some support with the web site and calendar. Of course I look forward to seeing you all, new and old faces alike, at our events coming up in 2010. We have a good calendar of events drafted, an energetic new board and dedicated volunteers, and I am confident that Diablo is in great shape as we start the new year.

The Racer's Group Tour *by Warren Gardner*

Launching from Marie Callendar's in Walnut Creek on Saturday morning about 9:15am on October 13, we had a group of about 19 cars with about 26 people. Tour Leader Warren Gardner passed out route direction sheets as well as a special rally tour questionnaire to give the Porsche passengers something to do in terms of a prize-winning competition. The drivers were forewarned to follow the group and directions closely in order to avoid getting lost, and in which case, proceed directly to Petaluma and The Racer's Group facility without trying to rejoin the tour group.

The circuitous route to Petaluma promised to take club members on stretches of road that they had never driven; a brazen boast considering how many Diablo members are serious local backroads explorers. In any case, we eventually came to take the following route. West on Hwy 24 to Upper Happy Valley Road, then north on Bear Creek Road, east on Alhambra Valley Road, then Alhambra Avenue, west on Franklin Canyon Road, north on McEwen Road, then Reservoir Road, then Canyon Lake Drive into rough-neck downtown Port Costa where we did a lazy but necessary U turn and went back out.

We then proceeded west on Carquinez Scenic Drive, then into and out of quaint Crockett, CA on the town streets of Winslow, Vallejo, Loring, Ralph and Pomona before roaring up Crockett Blvd to merge and go west on Cummings Skyway before hitting the US 80 overpass. Somewhere about this time Mike and Gail Vorkapich's Boxster decided it had shifted enough for one day and decided to call it quits on the spot. Blessed by good fortune and a curious CA Highway Patrolman who couldn't pass up checking out so many Porsches at one stop, the Vorkapich's managed to hail a wrecker and passenger Gail got a tow back to Walnut Creek. Driver Mike got picked up by good Samaritan Jack Kuhn and they stoutly soldiered on, along with a small empathetic contingent of Diablo drivers who eventually made their way on to TRG in Petaluma.

But we're getting ahead of ourselves. Meanwhile the main group of the Diablo tour crossed over US 80, went east on San Pablo Avenue by The Dead Fish restaurant, then onto US 80 east to cross the Carquinez Straits/Alfred Zampa Bridge to take the first exit to Sonoma Blvd thru Vallejo. We stopped in Vallejo for a bio break at the Vallejo Ferry area, then thru town took Curtola Parkway, Mare Island Way and Wilson Avenue. We left town on Hwy 37 Sears Point Road. At Sears Point we took Hwy 121 North and eventually merged into Hwy 116. After that we took Stage Gulch Road (which passed Willie Bird Way, if you happen to really know your turkeys!) on to Lakeville Hwy and then left to South McDowell Blvd and The Racers Group. Overall the distance was about 72 miles which we covered in about two hours time.

Upon arrival at The Racers Group we were met with another group of Diablo members who had driven straight there. By the time the day was over, we had 32 participants and about 24 cars. We got a nice tour at The Racer's Group courtesy of Martin Steger, their PCA Club Coordinator and general manager. We also had a fun time with the wine tasting as well. In summary, a good time was had by all, with the possible exception of Gail Vorkapich, but she's a trouper and will no doubt be back for more tours in the future!

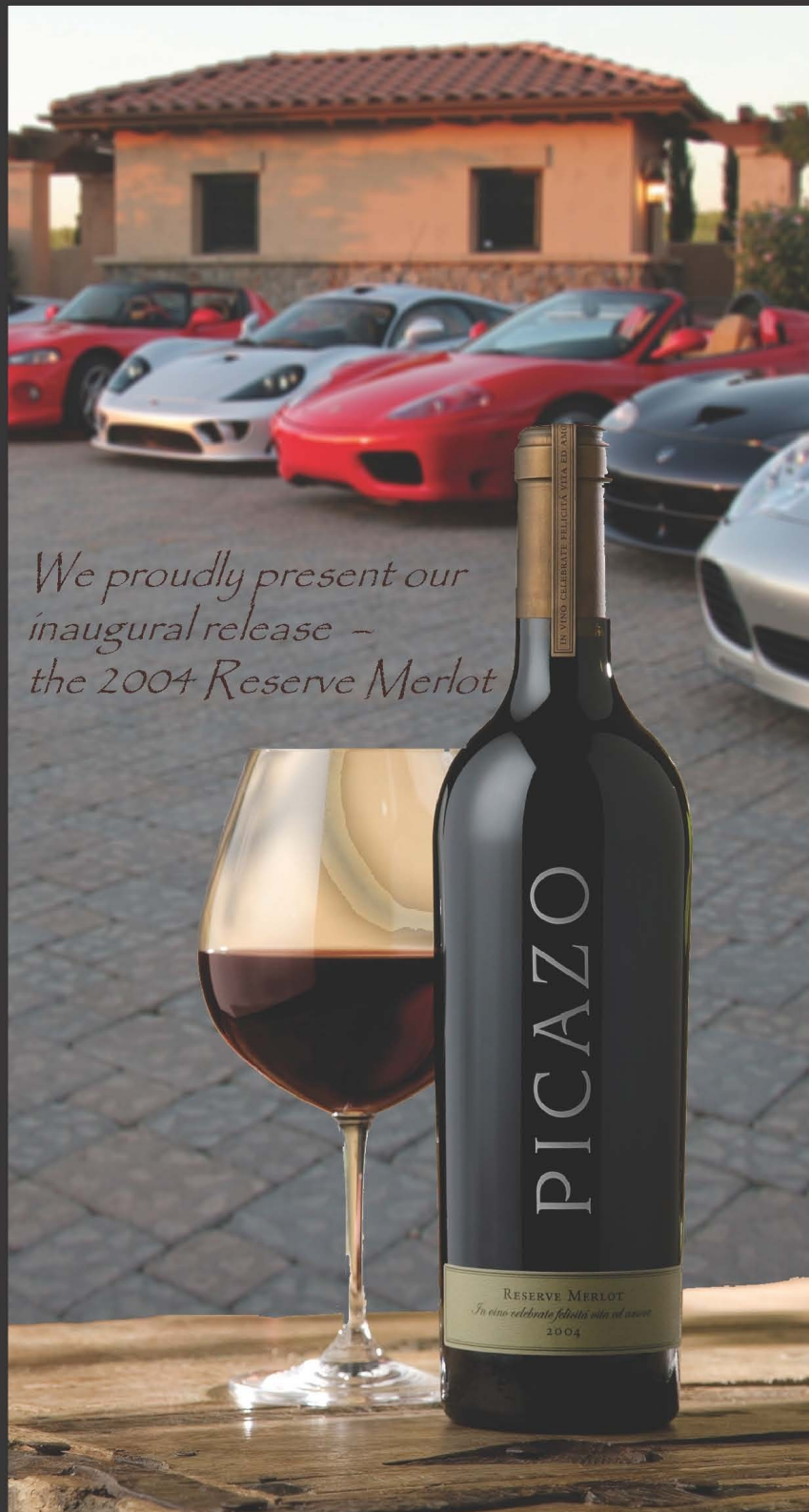

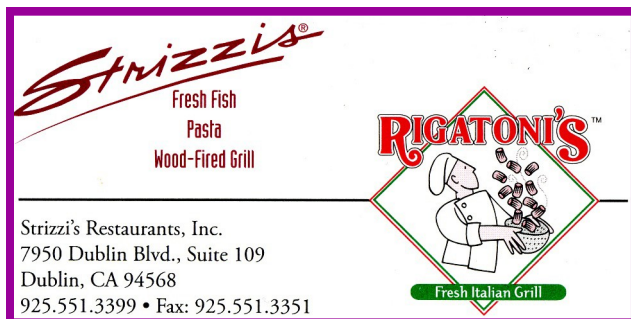

SF International Auto Show

The 52nd Annual San Francisco International Auto Show - I think there are a few more words and a brand name or two in the official title of the event, but I think that's quite enough already. I got there late in the day in an attempt to avoid the thickest crowds, but this still left a thicket around the most popular displays. If you didn't get a chance to attend, there's a link to all the photos I took at the end of this article.

Porsche was well represented despite any issues with the economy or the oft-discussed "merger" with Volkswagen. There was still a healthy crowd, right up there with any other exhibit on the floor, and a lot of the reason for this was the new Panamera on display. I suspect part of the reason was that most if not all the other models were locked, whereas you could sit in the Panamera and experience the *de luxe* interior.



There was a good crowd around the Lamborghini cars, and a big crowd around the new Camaros and Corvettes - especially the Transformers "Bumblebee" edition of the Camaro. The Cadillac Converj was also popular, on prominent display just as you entered one of the main exhibit halls. Likewise Lexus had a customized IS 350 convertible in a central location with a trick paint job and periodic live presentation.



The exhibit of the Academy of Art University collection of 1920s and 1930s autos, which were on display as part of a 30 year celebration, was unexpected. And if you poked into odd corners you discovered that there was a small section of vendor displays and a few games. But the biggest surprises were the 1937 Plymouth House Car, aka the Himsel Zeppelin Roadliner, built in Concord, CA; the "real" Mini Cooper in an out-of-the-way side hall, and the 550 Spyder and 356 Speedster, or replicas, that had been converted to electric vehicles - the conversion being why I hope they were replicas.

The show was a lot of fun to wander through, and ample demonstration that I need slightly different equipment to take top notch photos under those conditions. If it's over by the time you read this, consider marking your calendar for next year's event. Or perhaps if there's enough interest we could have a group outing of club members?

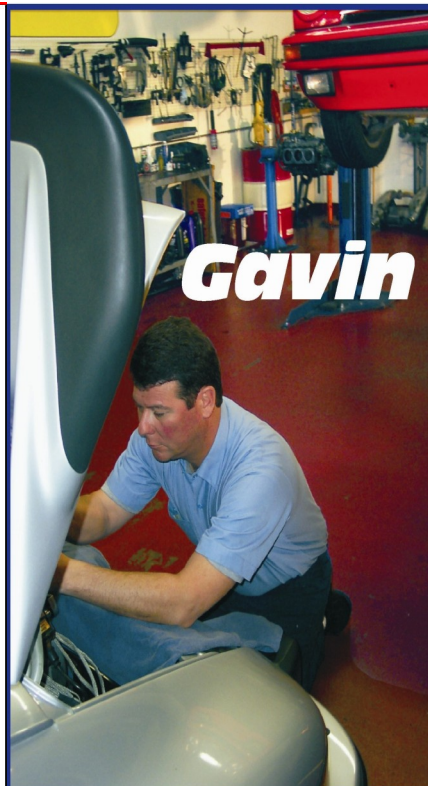

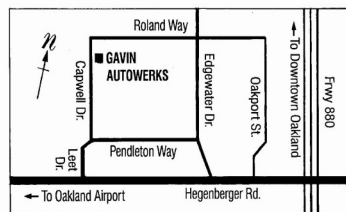

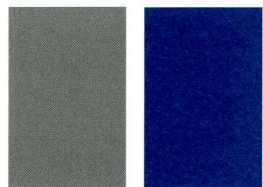
