Car #70 on the cover, came along the next year and, driven by John Fitzpatrick, became the champion of the US IMSA series. For those who felt that a late Advocate caused them to miss events, may I gently remind any who have internet access that there are two major sources of Region events information: the Region web page (see lower right on page 3) and my homepage file sharing folder (<http://homepage.mac.com/ lepprd/FileSharing3.html>). Look for a folder that says "Advocate" in combination with the desired month.

Regardless, of any other consideration, the online version of this newsletter is now always in color and available weeks ahead of the printed copy delivered by the Post Office. This colored PDF *Advocate* is typically posted between the 15th and the 20th of the month.

I have often expressed my pleasure in sharing photos with members, friends, and relatives. It is therefore a marvelous feeling to see that there were more than 1020 visitors to the homepage galleries before an error sent all the counters back to zero. Credit, if there is such a thing, for this big number mostly goes to the over 750 GGR and Zone 7 autocross visitors although having many relatives (my mother is 1 of 17 brothers and sisters) also helps.

The monthly membership numbers on page five are showing a slight dip which may or may not match up with the slowing economy. Fewer Porsches being sold and less money for items such as PCA membership fees are entirely logical explanations for fewer new members.

It would have been easy to lose interest or even end my membership, but I became more active (a serious understatement since being an Editor is a huge job) and the Region is, I hope, stronger as a result.

I was able to move into the Editor role because I truly enjoy graphic design and photography. If you get your batteries charged by working with our region's history, or cooking up challenging rallies (to name just two areas), then spice up how the Diablo Region does things by contacting Brian to volunteer.

If your skills are more toward leadership and efficiency in management, then get elected as a Director.







After breakfast on Saturday, October 11, a group of members made the short drive to Dyno Labs in San Ramon. Ray Razon, the owner, described his facility and its capabilities to us. After the talk and tour, we had the opportunity to have our cars run on the Dyno-jet Chassis Dyno.



Sergio Meza went first with his 911 time trial car. Sergio wanted to make sure it was not running too lean since he was running it on the track for the first time the following weekend.



I put my Boxster on the machine next, just to see what kind of power it made. It wasn't as powerful as I had hoped, but the power band was strong and flat from 3000 R.P.M. all the way to 6,000 R.P.M. Three runs were made in third and fourth gears and they were nearly identical.





At noon, Ray's brother came in and fixed a barbecue lunch for all attendees. It was an interesting, informative, and good time for all those that attended. It was a great introduction to the availability and possibilities of Dyno-tuning.

Owner Ray Razon earned our attention and respect for his expertise with careful attention to safety details, patient explanations of the technology, and his extensive array of championship autocross trophies. Consecutive year SCCA championships in the ultra competitive Bsp class makes a strong case for Ray's real world knowledge of high performance technology.

In addition to the Region, honors, the Museum sponsored the "Essence of Blackhawk" and the "Spirit of Blackhawk" (an original/unrestored car) awards and each came with a Family Membership to the Museum. Two tied for the "Spirit" trophy and Tom Sisson won the "Essence" category. All three owners and their cars can be seen across the page.

The event ended was an open invitation to the after-the-event dinner in the Blackhawk Center. This is always a great way to rest, unwind, and enjoy good food and conversation before heading home. This year there was still one more special treat in that Bob Garretson was our dinner guest. His great stories and special insight continued throughout the dinner.


