Tech Gespräch

That's German for "Tech Talk".

The PCA was started by a group of people who unofficially called them selves the "The Gripe Group" they had questions and were looking to share information about this infrequently encountered marquee in the land of big American muscle. So lets talk.

I wanted to share a bit about FLUIDS. Particularly; Power Steering fluids.

If your Porsche does have power steering the reservoir and fill cap may be in bit of an out of the way location. I know you know where to put the Gas, and would think most know where to put Oil, Water (if needed) and Brake Fluid ... even Washer Fluid. My most resent experience comes from an '07 Cayman. This exact encounter will be true for all Caymans and Boxsters.

The Power Steering reservoir and fill is under the engine cover and often forgotten. The fluid can run low, you may be lucky enough to hear a growl as you turn the steering wheel and know to check and fill. If you aren't lucky, low fluid can damage the steering rack leading to an expensive fix, the rack itself is over \$1200.

The fist thing that I would suggest is to check your fluid (OK . check them all and learn where they are). For a bit of prevention in any Power Steering system on any car ... change the fluid. Power Steering fluid is hygroscopic (tending to absorb moisture from the air). Many pro mechanics suggest changing it every 5 years or so. There have been recent upgrades for the fluids that Porsche now recommends to use. I was lucky enough to find (when my car was inspected for free for a DE) that fluid was low. Adding fluid helped, but a growl was still there a bit. After using a turkey baster 3 times to remove all the fluid from the reservoir then filling fluid, between just a drive around the block. The growl is gone and steering seems more precise. My fluid recommended had been up graded.

Looking at my service and maintenance books there is NO mention of checking Power Steering levels at ANY of the services !

Low fluid may be a sign of a leak somewhere.

Hope this helps you in some way.





Seventy Years Behind the Wheel

On Northern California Courses




I don't believe many of us reading this issue remember very many of the old and unusual Road Race Courses that have emerged over the last 60 years in Northern California. I'll attempt to list a number of them that used existing roads and streets and runways and a much smaller percentage that were constructed expressly for racing. Some years there were as many as 7 or 8 available to , SAN FRANCISCO REGION OF SCCA and once in a while, the year long Northern Calif. schedule would include even more tracks. On top of that, the drivers and sponsors that could afford to travel with their cars would plan on attending the races that were scheduled for Oregon, Washington and Southern California. The top finishers in all classes of Regional SCCA Races were then invited to participate in the National competition at Road Atlanta or other highly rated courses. Of course in the early days of post war road racing, the easiest courses to lay out and obtain were unused runways or abandoned airfields. Examples of these are Salinas Airport where James Dean was headed when he was killed. Jan and I were part of the very sad SCCA group that were anticipating his arrival. The new runways at Oakland had yet to feel the tires of aircraft when San Francisco Region held its first and only road race on the runways and taxi strips of the new airport. Military airfields also played an important role in early races. More than one race was held at Moffet Field in the South Bay Area and the same held true for Stead AFB, North of Reno. Possibly the oldest Airport course in Northern California was Buchanan Field in Concord. 1st race 1949.'

Two of the longest operating airport road courses were the Cotati Airport near Santa Rosa and Crow's Landing, the old Navy Strip off of Hwy. 5. Stockton CA, also played a major role in early racing. The Stockton Airport gave us some good course layouts for many years and then the city routed our Road Racing to the Port of Stockton. This new layout between warehouse buildings on Port access roads was somewhat like what we experienced at the Sacramento Fairgrounds. (The original Fairgrounds). Another course we had for a number of years was the retired Army Camp Stoneman in the middle of Pittsburg. Many building were still in place so it offered some unforgiving turns.

One of the most beautiful road courses in the early 50's was San Francisco's Golden Gate Park. It was not only beautiful but the meandering roadways almost looked like they were laid out for road racing. San Francisco plus the unique course attracted drivers from all over the U.S. and Europe. Another unusual, but very dangerous course was on the grounds of Candlestick Park. We don't necessarily think of the original Pebble Beach Course as laid out on existing roads but it was held on housing tract roads adjacent to the 17 Mile Drive. The proximity of the roads to all the wonderful pine trees turned out to be the cause of the demise of the course. However, the end of Pebble Beach led to the beginning of Laguna Seca in 1957. For many of you, Laguna Seca has been a special place since you first saw it or felt the feel of your tires on its demanding surface. It has always been very special to me since I laid out all of the turn worker locations for that 1st Race.



As for our specially designed road courses, and Laguna heads the list, we have few by comparison. One of the most accessible was the old Vaca Valley Raceway. Adjacent to HWY 80 just West of Vacaville, the road course consisted of a conventional oval attached to the road course. It has experienced many major races and other interesting events.

The last two specially designed road courses are Sears Point, most recently renamed Sonoma Raceway and Thunder hill owned by SCCA and recently expanded. A good many of you have driven both of them.
