2016 Tour Planning

As Diablo PCA is getting ready for its annual Events planning (Tours and Events), it is a good time for you to think about and contribute to Events and/or Tours. I'll let Marc handle the Events. If you visit the Diablo home page, you will find a button that will get to Eventbrite so that you can register. This is not a commitment, but to allow us to get a 'food-headcount.'

Don't have any ideas? Well, show up for a social event that could very well have you come up with an idea or contribute to an idea. Your individual life experiences and knowledge assist in making everyone's Porsche life better. Are you new to PCA? Come join us and find out what it is like to plan a year in advance.

Keep in mind that you are not held to the tour and there are no repercussions to a tour being cancelled. Has this happened? I have seen people cancel for one reason or another as life gets in the way.

I am here to assist you with the planning, if necessary. We have a form available to help understand any expenses associated with a tour. Pay-as-you-go is always preferred. Sometimes that is not viable. As an example, we have the never tried before tour & event: Zip Line on November 7th; that requires a deposit. This event required prior board approval with a down payment.

The next piece is Eventbrite. Why Eventbrite for tours and planning? First of all the Web App allows for us to capture headcount. Why is headcount needed? For formal PCA Tours, we have to file for PCA supplied insurance. This means we are also under the umbrella and guidance of PCA (safety & speed control). Eventbrite allows us to pre-collect money for an event. Yes, there is a surcharge associated with it, but the convenience to a tour leader is great. There is no money to collect at the last minute and time is spent instead on the driver's meetings.

Please don't confuse events like the Mercedes Tour or the New Year Livermore or the Go-Karting events. So any conclusion you came about these events – they were not sanctioned by Diablo or PCA. You merely were invited by Diablo and non-Diablo folks to participate in what was described as a fun event or drive.

High speed driving is not permitted by PCA. That is not to say you can organize your own non-Diablo events, we have one member who has her peeps for special fast runs, but they are outside of Diablo. They have fun too.

Don't be afraid to have things go wrong in the sense of a wrong turn or a missed milestone on your way somewhere. Practice the runs with a co-pilot or ask me to come along. Just don't try to kidnap me, as I may like it. Get a Delorme California map, don't rely on GPS. Don't do a GPS and map run at the same time as it will get you confused. There is nothing worse or funnier than the tour leader getting lost. If you really screw up – we have an award for you "The Dummkopf." There are many PCA luminaries on the list – it is in jest, but real. ***November 21 is your planning date – sign up and be there.***

The Tour has one thing that can't be replaced for you and others. **It is about the ride.**



Walt Lietz 1942—2015




As a note – I know Walter Lietz would have enjoyed this outing and Walt was remembered and will not be forgotten.


