

Diablo Region Porschephiles,

Have you enjoyed a great tour? How about a social event or the exhilaration of driving your Porsche on the track? All of these and other great member benefits are all possible because of members that had an idea or wanted to contribute to enhancing the Porsche ownership experience. These events often take considerable planning and commitments to site holders or other vendors that are needed to support the events. In many instances, the Region must commit resources weeks if not months in advance. For example, the number of meals must be committed to 7 days before the Annual Picnic but only 40 people may be signed up on that date, but more than 80 people typically attend. Knowing this, and not wanting to turn members away, the Region has to make a financial commitment for the additional meals.

The Region often opens registration on Eventbrite or MSR multiple weeks before the event to allow for an accurate attendance projection when we make site commitments. To assist our Region members who are hosting events during 2016, the Region will institute an enrollment premium 7 days before the event enrollment closes. The date and amount of the enrollment premium will be described in the event announcement. We hope that this will facilitate timely sign-ups and avoid surcharges by our vendors to accommodate late enrollees.

The Region has a great list of activities planned for 2016 and wants to make hosting an event as seamless as possible so more members can participate. So take a look at the schedule, find an activity and sign up early. We hope to see you at an upcoming tour, track day or social gathering soon.

As a courtesy to event planners or tour leaders, please sign up by the indicated deadline.

Deposits are made in advance based on a specified number of participants, and if more signups occur, there will be penalty fees




## Tips on Writing an Article for the Advocate

If you attend an event or participate on a tour, you may be asked by the host to compose a write-up for publication in the Advocate (Diablo's monthly newsletter). What a great opportunity to share your impressions, reactions and thoughts on the day's activities! Below are a few tips to assist you in describing your journey so other members will be excited to join the next event on the calendar.

- Describe how the day started (how many attended, weather, etc.). Use descriptions that place pictures in the readers' heads. Help the readers visualize themselves riding in the car with you or experiencing the activities at an event. Hook the readers and draw them into the day's happenings.
- Try to not make the article too "dry" with "blow-by-blow" directions or destinations without adding in plenty of descriptive dialogue.
- Mention specific names of locations, restaurants, wineries or individuals to give relevance to the voyage or event.
- Write to your audience. They all own a Porsche and understand the thrill of ownership.
- Mention why you enjoyed the tour/event.
- Be sure to "Thank" the host for setting up and hosting the tour or event.
- Creative Hints:
  - Review and revise
  - Be sure the article flows
  - Feel free to add emphasis where needed with **BOLD** type or ALL CAPS or colored text
  - Take notes during the tour or event so you can report details
  - Try to have an introduction, body and conclusion to your article
- Try to get the article to the Editor within 14 days of the tour or event.

Have fun and enjoy being published!!





"The Porsche 911 R was built specifically for motor racing in 1967. Now it is back—in a limited edition of just 991 units.

Orders are being taken now and will begin delivery Summer 2016."

"Weighing in at 3,021 lbs., or exactly 110 lbs. less than the outrageous 911 GT3 RS (a Stuttgart-built rocket we

also got to pilot), the 911 R doesn't even come with air conditioning or a stereo as standard equipment. You can add them on via the options sheet, however. The only transmission offered is a compact 6speed manual. That's right, if you want this car, you're going to have to take some lessons in piloting a manual gearbox.

To achieve these weight savings, Porsche has crafted the front luggage compartment lid and front fenders out of lightweight carbon fiber. The roof, meanwhile, is made out of magnesium. Porsche has also jettisoned the rear seats, along with a good degree of sound insulation. This not only lowers weight, it also significantly drops the car's center of gravity, to aid in corner-carving handling.

Powering the 911 R is a naturally-aspirated 4.0-liter flat-6 engine that you'll find in the GT3 RS. Pushing out a total of 500-horsepower, this screaming motor hauls the rear-wheel-drive R from 0 to 60 mph in only 3.7 seconds.

If you want one of the ultimate statements of 911 motoring, act fast and get ready to spend a lot. Porsche will build only 991 examples of the 911 R, and the starting price when it goes on sale in the U.S. will be \$185,950."





### "DESIGN: Old School. New Thrill."

"A homage. A rebirth. A childhood dream. A 911 straight out of Flacht. The new 911 R is all of this. All at once. Design and body based on the 911 GT3. However, the 911 R features an extendible rather than a fixed rear wing. In practice, this means: The 911 R is 44 mm wider at the rear than the 911 Carrera. This gives it an even fuller stance on the road. And enhances the Classic 911 virtues: low, wide, flat.

Eye-catching: the characteristic engine air intake grill with the historical 911 R model designation. Directly underneath: the centrally positioned Black painted twin tailpipes of the exhaust system. These deliver the unadulterated sound of a thoroughbred naturally aspirated engine.

Historical reference: The 2 stripes that extend along the entire length of the vehicle. Motor sports elegance, if there is such a thing."
