Hello Diablo Members!

Well, we're in the thick of "Car Season."

We've already hosted more than a half dozen tours. Our **39th annual Memorial Day Car Show** had over 100 cars, and we donated \$2,000 to charity. We will have had our second **High-Performance Driving Event** when you read this. We provide **monthly** cars and coffee, dinners, and **weekly** breakfasts. Our Zone 7 **autocross** and **concurs** seasons are underway, and our neighboring regions have great offerings, such as Sacramento Region's CRAB and Shasta Region's Zone 7 Tour. If you're not active, you're not trying!



Look on the weekly eBlast to signup for our Annual Picnic on **July 30th**. We're fortunate to again hold it on the lawn in front of the chapel at St. Mary's in Moraga. We'll have vendor displays as well as lunch catered by Fudrucker's. We're limited to 80 cars on the lawn, but with additional parking, we usually have well more than 100 cars in attendance. We anticipate more than 250 attendees, and new members and children are free! It's an opportunity to get acquainted with new members and catch up with friends.

In October, you'll receive a ballot to elect Directors to three open seats and approve revised Bylaws. If you are an Active Member of PCA and interested in running for the Board of Directors, please get in touch with me at diablopca.president@gmail.com. Bylaws are the foundation for the governance of PCA Regional Clubs. According to the National Bylaws, Chartered Regional Clubs must comply with National rules. Therefore, a Regional Club's Bylaws must not conflict with National bylaws. To assist Regions in adopting bylaws compliant with National Bylaws, PCA has developed a Regional Bylaws template for Regions to adopt. The Diablo Board is working with PCA National's Policy Committee in revising our existing Bylaws to bring them into compliance and these revised Bylaws. This revision will be presented to you for approval.

Finally, "The Advocate," our official means of communication with the membership, is undergoing some changes. Due to the current use of social media and the weekly eBlast, the Advocate is no longer the principal means of communicating information regarding upcoming events to the membership. But it continues to be an effective means of communicating the nature of events through longer stories and photographs than social media allows. Also, it is more effective in welcoming new members and

informing them how to get "plugged into" Diablo activities. Therefore, the Advocate will be published quarterly and integrated with our website, diablo-pca.org, and weekly eBlasts. Whether you are an event organizer or participant, we solicit your written descriptions and photographs communicating your experience participating in Diablo events.

I look forward to seeing you at one of our events. Please come up and introduce yourself.

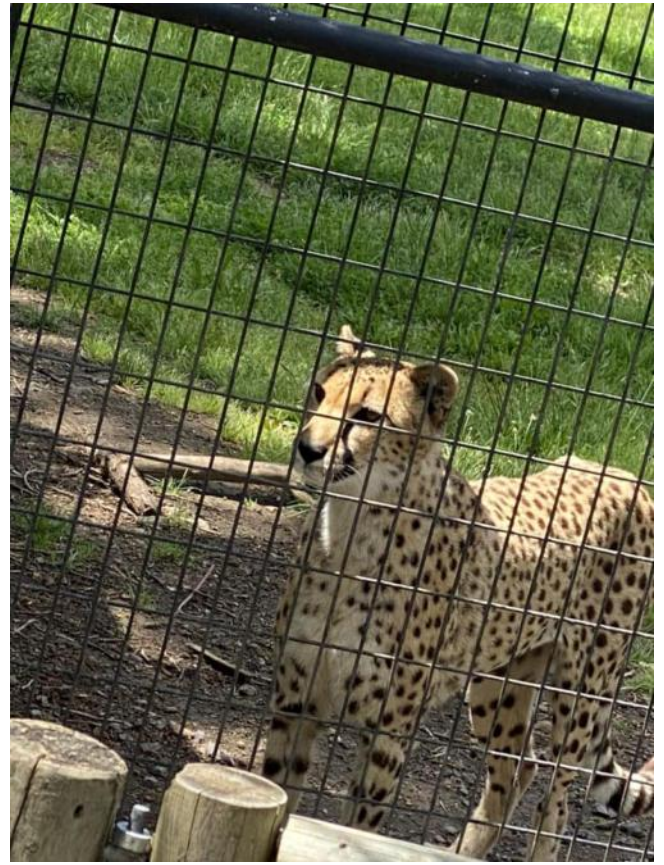

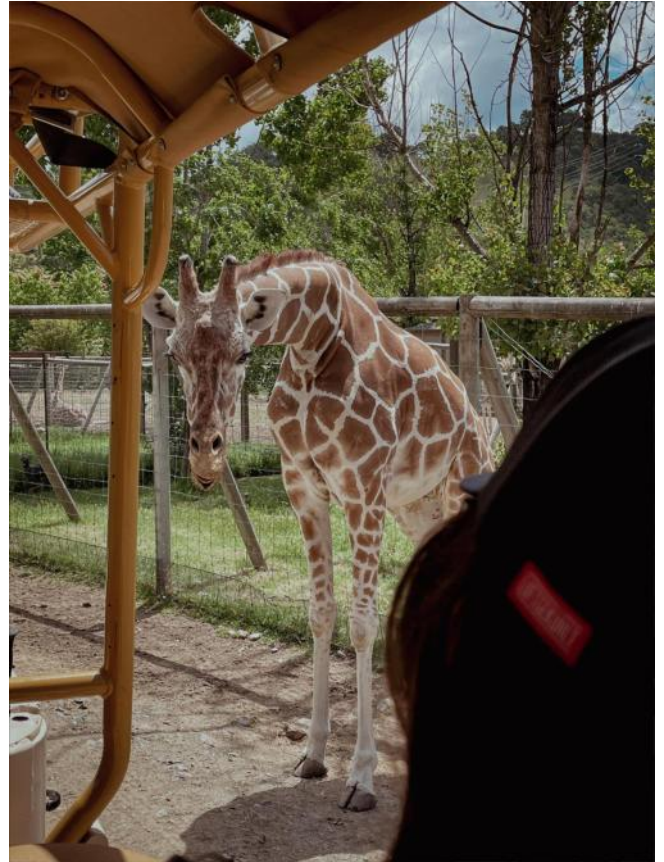

After the driving tour, we did a 30-minute walking tour at which time we saw many different species of birds.

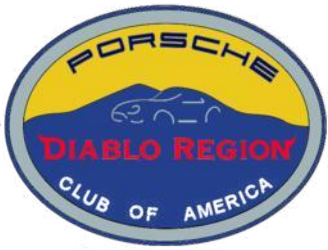

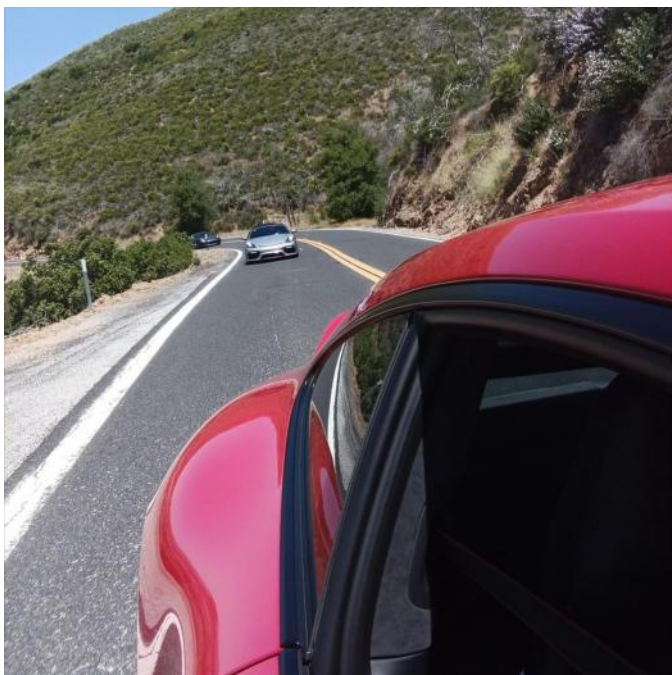


With the Drivers meeting completed, the tour leaders Vic Linares and Carolyn Wong lead the intrepid drivers and their squires from Livermore, traveling east on highway 580 and 120 through the valley towns that lead to the gold country and all of its treasures. Heading towards Oakdale and beyond, they traveled Highway 120, which opens up into a beautiful ribbon of winding road, surrounded by grassy hills and rock formations. This road is the gateway to Yosemite and the western foothills of the Sierra range.

Yankee Hill Cooking School Tour

On Saturday, May 20th, the Diablo Region participants met at the International House of Pancakes on First Street in Livermore at 8:30AM. After a driver's safety meeting we departed for a fun filled drive and cooking lesson.

We then took route 120 and 99 further east until we headed north on Jack Tone Road through the fruit and nut orchards. Next, we headed east on Highway 4 to Farmington where we had our bio break at the Mobil station.

After our break we continued East on Highway 4 through the rolling hills and cattle grazing land towards the Sierra Nevada foothills. The road curved through the oak woodlands until we turned south on Parrots Ferry Road. We turned left on Jackson Street to Yankee Hill Road until we arrived at the cooking school. After parking we entered the school to find our instructor, Ron Erickson and a copy of the recipes of the Mexican lunch we would be preparing.

Ron oversaw our chopping, mixing and cooking as we prepared our appetizers of avocado hummus, chicken and pork quesadillas, and Pico de Gallo served with chips.



Using the carnitas and pollo that had been slow cooked overnight, we made enchilada sauce and assembled chicken and pork enchiladas. Others made masa tamale dough and then assembled pork and chicken tamales to be steamed. Rice was cooked in a rice cooker and then mixed with salsa for a take on Mexican rice. A refreshing Pico de Gallo salad was made with oranges, red onion, lettuce and dressing.
